Notice of Proposed Major Utility Facility

This is the second public notice published in regard to this Proposed Major Utility Facility. AMP-Ohio published the first notice in the Daily Sentinel newspaper, Pomerov, Ohio, on August 24, 2007.

Name and Description of the Proposed Facility

American Municipal Power-Ohio (AMP-Ohio) proposes to construct a pulverized coal-fired electric power generation plant in Letart Township, Meigs County, Ohio, on apx. 1.000 acres adjacent to the Ohio River. This project is known as the American Municipal Power Generating Station (AMPGS). The proposed project will include a 960 megawatt net power generation plant, a 133 acre landfill and barge handling facilities on the Onio River. The accompanying map depicts the proposed site for the AMPGS facility. It should be noted that due to reduced scale and limited detail this map should be used only as a general guide. More detailed information regarding the general layout of the proposed facility is included in the application, described below. that AMP-Ohio has filed with the Ohio Power Siting Board.

Application Now Pending

An application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to construct, operate and maintain the AMPGS facility is now pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board"). This application has been assigned case number 06-1358-EL-BGN This case number should be included in all communications with respect to this proceeding. Specific detailed information on the proposed project is included in the application currently pending before the Board.

Criteria Used to Review the Application

The following eight criteria are set forth in Section 4906.10 (A) of the Revised Code and will be used, along with additional information, by the Board in the reviewing of the application for a certificate to lic Hearing construct, operate and maintain the AMPGS facility:

In the case of a major utility facility described in division (B)(1) of Section 4906.01 of the Revised Code, the Board shall presume the need for the facility as that need is stated in an application pursuant to division (A)(3) of Section 4906.06 of the Revised Code;

· Whether the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology, the nature and economics of various alternatives, and other pertinent considerations;

· The facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the regional power grid of electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems, and the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reli-

Section 4906.07 of the Revised Code provides that:

(A) Upon the receipt of an application complying with Section 4906.06 of the Revised Code, the Power Siting Board shall promptly fix a date for a public hearing thereon, not less than sixty nor more than ninety days after such receipt. and shall conclude the proceeding as expeditiously as practicable.

(B) On an application for an amendment of a certificate, the Board shall hold a hearing in the same manner as a hearing is held on an application for a certificate if the proposed change in the facility would result in any material increase in any environmental impact of the facility or a substantial change in the location of all or a portion of such a facility other than as provided in the alternates set forth in the application.

Opportunity for Comment and Intervention

Section 4906.08(C) of the Revised Code provides that: The Board shall accept written or oral testimony from any person at the public hearing, but the right to call and examine witnesses shall be reserved for parties. However, the Board may adopt rules to exclude repetitive, immaterial, or irrelevant testimony.

The deadline for filing a petition to intervene in Case No. 06-1358-EL-BGN as established by the Ohio Power Siting Board or the administrative law judge is up to five days prior to the scheduled date for the non-adjudicatory hearing, or later if good cause is shown. However, the Board strongly encourages interested persons who wish to intervene in the adjudicatory hearing to file their petitions as early as possible.
