## WITHDRAWAL OF MOTION

PAETEC Communications, Inc. and US LEC Communications Inc. (collectively, the "Applicants"), by their attorneys and in accordance with the instructions of the Commission's staff, hereby withdraw their Motion for Waiver filed in the above-captioned case on or about October 1, 2007.

The Motion had requested a waiver of the requirement, pursuant to Sections 4901:1-6-10(A)(2), (3), and (4) of the Commission's Rules, that notices of a competitive local exchange carrier's discontinuance of operations be sent to incumbent local exchange carriers and customers no less than ninety (90) days in advance. By e-mail of Wednesday, October 24, 2007, the Commission's staff advised the Applicants' attorneys that separate authority for discontinuance of US LEC's operations was not required in connection with the above-referenced transaction, and therefore that the 90-day notice requirement was inapplicable. The staff therefore requested that the Applicants withdraw the Motion for Waiver.

For all the foregoing reasons, the Applicants withdraw the Motion for Waiver in the above-captioned case.
