Dear Ms. Jenkins:

Revised tariff sheets have been filed with the FCC to amend Verizon Tariff FCC No. 14, Facilities for Interstate Access, in which Verizon North Inc. concurs for intrastate applications.

Transmittal No. 870 – Effective December 11, 2007
With this transmittal, Verizon is revising FCC No. 14 to remove the OC3, OC3c, OC12 and OC12c rate elements included in the Banded Optical Transport (BOT) offering to the federal government. There is no customer demand for these federal government BOT rate elements. Also, Verizon is removing obsolete references to and rate pages for STM1 and E1 BOT service as these capacities were previously offered only in the State of Hawaii.


The actual filing documents may be viewed on the FCC's Internet website – www.fcc.gov – by doing the following:

1. On the FCC's main page www.fcc.gov at the top of the page, next to the FCC login, you will find a horizontal list of options. Click on E-Filing.
2. On the next page, scroll down until you see the paragraph on the Electronic Tariff Filing Systems (ETFS) and click on Electronic Tariff Filing System ETFS.
3. On the next page, scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on "Public Access" block.
4. On the next page, click on the "Browse Filed Tariff Documents" block.
5. On the next page, click on the "Browse Documents Filed by an ILEC" block.
6. On the next page, click on "Verizon Telephone Companies."
7. On the next page, click on "FCC14". However, before moving to the next page, you may want to bookmark this page in order to skip Steps 1-6 in the future.
8. On the next page, you will be shown a table of the filings that have been made for that tariff number starting with the most recent. Click on the part of the filing you want to view under the heading "View PDF". Each filing may have several parts, so look for the transmittal number on each line.

With this transmittal, Verizon is submitting tariff pages to remove the OC3, OC3c, OC12 and OC12c rate elements included in the Banded Optical Transport (BOT) offering to the federal government in Tariffs F.C.C. Nos. 14 and 16. This service was subject to Verizon's Petition for Forbearance from Title II and Computer Inquiry Rules with Respect to Broadband Services which was granted by operation of law on March 17, 2006.¹ There is no customer demand for these federal government BOT rate elements.

Also as part of this filing, Verizon is removing obsolete references to and rate pages for STM1 and E1 Banded Optical Transport in Tariff F.C.C. No. 14. These capacities were previously offered only in the State of Hawaii. The removal of these references and rate page information has no impact on customers.

Supporting material, as specified under Section 61.38 of the Commission's Rules, is not required with this filing.


This transmittal letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).
