

Option P is a one-way, multipoint service provided through MCI WorldCom, allowing the furnishing of long distance telecommunication service between a single calling station and two or more called stations. MCI Forum Conference Calling requires a teleconferencing bridge port for each called station. The necessary bridge ports are provided by a designated MCI WorldCom Conference Center and are available as a Dial-Out Service or as a Personal 800 Meet-Me Service. All MCI Forum Conference Calling calls are rounded to the next higher full minute. Calculation of usage begins at the connect time of the first called party and ends when either the last participant in the conference call disconnects or the MCI WorldCom Conference Center operator terminates the Call. This service is not available for collect calling nor for use with Metered Use Service Option B (Credit Card).

A conference call is initiated by making a reservation of a date and time for the call. Reservations of MCI WorldCom's Conference Calling Service can be placed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Conference calls can be held on any day of the week at anytime. Cancellation of scheduled conference calls within thirty (30) minutes of the scheduled conference call time are subject to the charges specified below.

.111 Methods of Conference Calling.1111 Dial-Out Service

Dial-Out Conference Calls are established by an MCI WorldCom Conference Operator. To receive this type of conference calling, the customer must arrange for the participating callers to be called by the MCI WorldCom Conference Operator at the pre-arranged date and time.

.1112 Personal 800 Meet-Me Service

Personal 800 Meet-Me allows the customer to permanently reserve an 800 number for Conference Calling use by that customer only during specified periods. Each call to the 800 number is initiated separately by each participant. When the 800 number is called, at a pre-arranged date and time, an MCI WorldCom Conference Operator intercepts the call on a bridge and places the caller on line along with any other participants. A passcode can be used to ensure secured Conference Calling. The Conference Operator can stand by and announce each caller, if needed.

.112 Monthly Recurring Charges

Intercity Facilities Usage Charges: The per minute rates for all Conference Calling calls are set forth in MCI WorldCom FOC Tariff No. 1.

.113 Service Availability

Option P is available from all exchanges which have been converted to equal access in cities set forth in Section C-7, Table I.

MCI 900 Service is an inbound, long distance, voice-grade telecommunications service that permits callers to place long distance calls to the Customer's stations in one location from stations in diverse geographical service areas, and is an add-on to MCI 900 Service filed in MCI WorldCom's F.C.C. Tariff No. 1. MCI 900 Service Customers may provide live or pre-recorded messages to callers using Customer's own equipment.

It is the customer's responsibility to provide answer supervision back to the MCI WorldCom point of connection even when the MCI 900 Service is connected to switching equipment of a Customer-provided communications system. In such cases, the equipment or system must provide appropriate supervision so that the measure of chargeable time begins upon the delivery of the call to the customer's switching equipment or communications system and ends upon termination of the call.

.141 Monthly Recurring Charges

.1411 Termination Access Line Charges: An MCI 900 customer must use Dedicated Access at each 900 Service terminating location. The access must provide hardware answer supervision.

.14111 Dedicated Termination

.141111 T-1 Digital Access - Charges associated with T-1 Digital Access are billed in accordance with MCI WorldCom's F.C.C. Tariff No. 1, Section C-2.0221 and C-2.02221.

.1412 Special Access Surcharge¹ - Applicable for Dedicated Terminating Access to MCI 900 Service.

.14121 Dedicated Termination: The monthly charges for Special Access Surcharge for each voice grade equivalent channel are shown in the table in Section C-2.02113 of MCI WorldCom's F.C.C. Tariff No. 1 (No Non-recurring charges apply.)

¹The Special Access Surcharge, imposed by the Local Exchange Carrier, will not apply to those customers who furnish MCI WorldCom with an Exemption Certificate (as defined herein).
