<u>ENTRY</u>

The Commission finds:

- (1) On November 28, 2007, staff filed a memo in this docket indicating that it was contacted by the Ohio Rail Development Commission regarding the authorization for the installation by RJ Corman Railway (RJC) of grade crossing warning devices at the Jaysville-St. Johns grade crossing (525-439Y) in Darke County.
- (2) In its memo, staff indicated that, due to a misunderstanding, staff believed that the city of Greenville owned and operated the rail line and, therefore, no Commission authorization was required for this project. Staff noted that, on October 29, 2007, it learned that RJC operated the trains utilizing the line and, as a result, Commission approval should have been granted for the project. Staff recommends that the Commission issue an entry acknowledging that RJC has installed an active grade crossing warning device at the grade crossing using federal funds.
- (3) Upon review, the Commission finds that RJC should have been authorized to install the crossing warning devices at this grade crossing.

It is, therefore,

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ORDERED, That copies of this entry be served upon the RJ Corman Railway and its counsel, and all interested persons of record.
