ENTRY

The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) By attorney examiner entry issued on January 29, 2008, interested persons were afforded an opportunity, until February 1, 2008, to comment on a staff report of investigation filed in this matter on January 24, 2008. The January 24, 2008, staff report of investigation, among other things, offered a recommendation on an application filed by Verizon North Inc. seeking a limited exemption, pursuant to Rule 4901:1-5-02, Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.), of the obligation to clear out-of-service trouble reports within 24 hours as set forth in Rule 4901:1-5-20(B)(4), O.A.C.
- (2) On February 4, 2008, the Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel (OCC) filed comments as well as a motion for leave to file comments out of time (motion for leave). In support of its motion for leave, the OCC claims that it was unaware of the examiner's January 29, 2008, entry affording interested persons until February 1, 2008, with an opportunity to comment on the staff report of investigation. The OCC further claims that the document was not available on the Commission's Docketing Information System until February 4, 2008, and that the mailed copy of the examiner's entry was not received by the OCC until the afternoon of February 1, 2008. Based on these factors, the OCC submits that good cause has been shown to warrant an extension of time to file comments in this matter.
