Today Rex had our property resurveyed for the purpose of possibly moving the proposed pipeline further south than its original proposed location. I went out to talk to the surveyors and found out they were only thinking of moving the pipeline 20 ft. south (80 ft. north from the center of Duke Energy's transmission lines). We feel this is still too close to our home and our trees and their root systems would still be in danger from the boring operation. I cannot understand Rex's apparent refusal to move this pipeline to the south side of the power lines. The surveyors stated the creek enters into that decision but the creek has no affect any where on our property. There is plenty of room on vacant land once they would cross Gardner Rd. to come back to their choice of locations on that side. Staying on the north side of the power lines would also destroy a large number of mature pine trees on property directly behind ours owned by Sanders Financial Group. This could add to drainage problems onto our property. Our vacant lot has as much land available to the south of Dukes power lines as it does to the north and more if you count the approx. 40 ft. additional owned by Sanders Fin. Group before you get near the creek. Please question Rex's decision to stay so close to our home when they have such a workable alternative that would really be less expensive for them and safer for us people who didn't ask for this pipeline in the first place.
