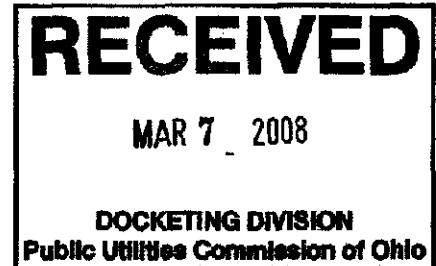

Dear Commission,

This letter is in response to the numerous postings on the FERC website regarding the conduct of the Rockies Express Pipeline LLC organization. There are numerous accounts documented on how Rockies has abused the system, violated the law, and shown total disregard for the landowner and the environment. Rockies shows no regard for anything or anyone including FERC and amazingly they are not reprimanded in any way. Rockies have made a mockery of the entire system and yet it appears they will be greatly rewarded for their actions. One can't help but believe that Rockies connections with the current administration has made them feel that they are "above the law" and that their actions will have no consequences, other than putting money in their pocket. The taxpayer can only hope that FERC with its ties to the current administration doesn't feel obligated to play the same game.
