Corporate Structure.

The corporate structure of Eagle Energy is a Limited Liability Corporation (LLC) with its primary area of interest being residential and small and mid to large commercial and industrial customers primarily focused in Southwestern Ohio and the serving area of Duke Energy.

Eagle Energy has developed a strategic business relationship with several Commission certified suppliers in providing or potentially providing electric service under the Ohio Customer Choice program. Eagle has extended those business relations to other jurisdictions as well.

Eagle Energy also has existing contractual relationships with the Village of Indian Hill and Green Township in providing advice concerning governmental aggregation for residential customers within those communities.

Company History.

The entity's business plan has been developed in order to provide end-user customers an opportunity to make an election concerning their supplier of electricity. The entity is currently certified to provide aggregation, power marketer and power broker services¹. Over the course of its history, Eagle has provided aggregation of more than 300,000 MWH of electricity for commercial, industrial and other public authority rate classes. While its total business plan has not materialized, Eagle desires to maintain its current certification status in the hope that a strategic partner will be able to compete directly with Duke. Eagle has been able to offer similar services in other jurisdictions. However, the existing rate structure continues to be a real impediment to competition in Eagle's opinion.

The serving area will continue to be Southwestern Ohio within the distribution network of Duke Energy. The services to be provided will be aggregation and market broker services.

Consulting has also been provided as an ancillary service particularly as customers are educated about competitive services. Similar services may be provided to municipal customers desiring to pursue municipal aggregation alternatives.



Experience and Plans.

The applicant intends to continue to be very focused on residential and small and mid to large commercial and industrial customers by identifying their energy requirements and matching the customers' energy requirements with available resources from suppliers certified by the Commission. Eagle Energy intends to continue to provide brokering/aggregation services to retail end-user customers when this Application is approved.

The business plans call for direct contact with customers and identifying potential energy savings, depending upon available supplies. The specific services to be rendered include price comparison, energy savings and monitoring Commission activities that may impact future actions by the customer. In all cases, the customer will remain the unilateral decision-maker in determining energy supplies.

Eagle Energy intends to make the decision-making process clearer for the customer. The management team has a combined one-hundred years' of experience in regulatory and utility matters, including numerous proceedings before the Commission and it will utilize this expertise in working with and informing customers.

APPLICANT TECHNICAL CAPABILITY

Operations

Eagle Energy intends to rely on third parties to arrange for the transmission and distribution of electricity. Eagle Energy's primary activities will be in the operating area of Duke Energy. Eagle Energy has submitted an application with MISO in order to purchase power directly but a third party with sufficient generation reserves and a desire to sell electricity into the Cincinnati market must be secured. While discussions with several entities have been held none of those parties envision a viable market at this time. Eagle remains optimistic that that environment will change.

Operations Expertise

Eagle Energy does not believe operations expertise is required to the extent that the contemplated transactions are of a marketing nature rather than a commodity-market based operations transaction. Eagle Energy's expertise is in the area of contract negotiations, tariff writing and explanation and cost of ancillary services, all necessary in order to complete any deal of the magnitude Eagle Energy contemplates. If the right scenario unfolds, then a third party would provide all back office support.
