

Re: Docket CP07-208-000 Rockies Express, LLC-East

Dear Secretary:

I just wanted to make sure you all were aware of our little earthquake today. It got me out of bed about 5:45 a.m. We also had a small aftershock while I am sitting here writing this letter. Several citizens in the counties south of Indianapolis have warned REX and FERC this area is prone to earthquakes. Some damage occurred in Louisville, KY and Mt. Carmel, IL, and elsewhere.

To quote the Final EIS, Page 4-6: "The REX East Project route crosses an area of relatively low seismic risk. No active faults were identified in the vicinity of the REX East Project...." Is it possible this study was done by REX and not FERC? It brings to mind the Murray Energy coal mine subsidence safety "omission". You just never know what the real story is unless you check it out yourselves.

I have included a picture of the map showing the epicenter of the 5.4 magnitude quake. It seems that FERC should be concerned the pipeline doesn't become known as "WRECKS" instead of "REX".

Once again, I just want to keep you informed. You may want to advise PHMSA of this also.

Maybe a higher power than FERC and PHMSA is sending you a timely message?
