Onvoy, Inc. d/b/a Onvoy Voice Services ("	Onvoy"), by its attorneys and pursuant to

Onvoy, Inc. d/b/a Onvoy Voice Services ("Onvoy"), by its attorneys and pursuant to OAC 4901-1-24(D), moves for a protective order to prevent public disclosure of the confidential and proprietary financial information included as Exhibits D-2 and D-3 in Onvoy's Telecommunications Supplemental Application Form for Carrier Certification. In support of this Motion, Onvoy states as follows:

- 1. Onvoy is applying for authorization to provide local exchange and competitive telecommunications services in the State of Ohio. As part of that Application, Onvoy provides its most recent audited financial statements as Exhibit D-2 and the unaudited financial information of Onvoy's parent, Zayo Group, LLC, as Exhibit D-3 (together the "Confidential Exhibits").
- 2. Onvoy is a privately held company whose sole owner is Zayo Group, LLC ("Zayo" and together with Onvoy, the "Company"). Zayo is also a privately held company. Therefore, neither Onvoy or Zayo is required to file financial information with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. Nor does the Company otherwise disclose its financial information to the public.
- 3. Onvoy and Zayo use their best efforts to keep and maintain the confidentiality of the Confidential Exhibits. To the best of the Company's knowledge, the Confidential Exhibits have not been disclosed or released to the public.

4. The Confidential Exhibits derive economic value from not being generally known to and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by other person who can obtain economic value from their disclosure and use. Specifically, the information contained therein is extremely sensitive financial information that could be used by competitors to determine revenue and other information damaging to the Company. Disclosure of such information would be extremely detrimental and could be used by the Company's competitors to materially affect the Company's ability to compete effectively.

5. Due to the sensitive nature of the Confidential Exhibits, it is appropriate for the Commission to limit access to it. The Confidential Exhibits should solely be used by the Commission in exercising its governmental functions in considering Onvoy's Application.

There is no legitimate purpose or public interest to be served in disclosing the Confidential Exhibits to the Company's current or future competitors or to any person other than the appropriate staff of the Commission.

WHEREFORE, Onvoy, Inc. respectfully requests that the Commission grant a Protective Order allowing Exhibits D-2 and D-3 of the Application to be treated as confidential.
