The Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel ("OCC") supports the Motion to Stay¹ filed by the Ohio Partners for Affordable Energy ("OPAE") on June 3, 2008, in the above-captioned proceedings. OPAE is asking the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("PUCO") to stay the PUCO's recent and unprecedented approval of residential rates for natural gas service based on the "straight fixed variable" rate design that features a higher monthly customer charge (from \$6.00 currently up to ultimately \$25.33 in 2009) and a corresponding lower per-unit charge for collecting distribution costs from Duke's 380,000 residential consumers. Granting the stay will avoid the additional customer confusion that would result if the new rate design is implemented now and then reversed upon the applications for rehearing that OPAE, as well as OCC, will be filing or upon any appeal.
