- Decrease consumer's Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP) payment percentage from 15% to 7% for individuals 50 and older
- Review the standards used to determine PIPP eligibility
- Require utility companies to inform all individuals about the Medical Certification process
- Require utility companies to give tenants notice if the landlord is behind on payments and provide a notice to tenants indicating that the tenant can deposit money if the landlord is behind in payments.
- Eliminate interest and all up front charges and set compounding interest rate for being on payment plan at 10%
- Review the high deposit amount required for reconnection and penalty deposits. Rejection of HEAP payment from utilities

- Provide optional maintenance program
 Require local payment centers
 Allow customers to receive credit for payments made from an outside the source
