

Rockies Express Pipeline LLC, REX-East Project

Request to Proceed for Construction in Exclusion Zone and Clarification for Construction Activity on Tract with Travel Lane - Spread A-1, Missouri, Illinois and Spread D, Indiana

Ms. Bose:

Rockies Express hereby files with the Commission a request for a Notice to Proceed (NTP) for previously identified Exclusion Zones in Spreads A-1 and D of the REX-East Project<sup>1</sup> and requests clarification for construction activity across tracts with a travel lane. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) granted NTP for Spreads A-1 and D on July 22, 2008 and August 1, 2008, respectively, identifying exclusion zones in both areas.

For the specific areas set forth below, Rockies Express has completed the outstanding environmental surveys and has received agency clearance for portions of the Spreads A-1 and D construction exclusion areas. The necessary documentations to support this request from the Missouri, Illinois, and Indiana State Historic Preservation Offices (SHPOs) are provided in attachment A. The drawings depicting the requested clearance areas are provided in attachment B. Attachment B also includes a table listing the clearance areas for this request, as well as previously submitted requests that are outstanding. Due to the information provided in the table and drawings, attachment B is privileged and confidential.

The REX-East project was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity pursuant to Section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission on May 30, 2008 in this docket. Rockies Express Pipeline LLC, 123 FERC ¶ 61,234 (2008). On June 2, 2008, Rockies Express, pursuant to Section 157.20(a) of the Commission's Regulations, 18 C.F.R. § 157.20(a), notified the Commission that it accepted the Commission's Order.

#### Spread A-1

In Spread A-1, the Commission identified two exclusion zones between MPs 29.4 and 29.6 and MPs 49.9 and 52.3 that were established to protect several sensitive resources requiring mitigation (See Commission July 22, 2008, NTP Order for Spread A-1). Having received the Missouri and Illinois SHPO concurrences, Rockies Express respectfully requests notice to proceed with construction commencing at MP 29.4 and clarification of use of the travel lane across tract IL-PK-034.000 as approved in the Illinois Treatment Plan No. 3. Specifically:

- Commence construction between the western boundary of tract MO-PI-038.000 (MP 29.4) and the eastern boundary of tract MO-PI-038.000 (MP 29.6) (see attached drawing D-1280-105-011; SHPO concurrence on report REX-EAST-MO-17, received 9/29/08);
- 2) Commence construction between the western boundary of tract IL-PK-034.000 (MP 51.1) and the field ditch and exclusion fencing for the sensitive resource starting at the center of tract IL-PK-034.000 (MP 51.3) (see attached drawings D-1280-105-019 and 1280-A-SR-060; SHPO concurrence on report REX-EAST-IL-30, received 9/5/08); and
- 3) Rockies Express requests use of the travel lane from the field ditch and exclusion fencing for the sensitive resource starting at the center of tract IL-PK-034.000 (MP 51.3) to the western edge of County Road 2445 (MP 51.6) which road will be used to facilitate the "move-around" of the construction spread (see attached drawings D-1280-105-019 and 1280-A-SR-060; SHPO concurrence on report REX-EAST-IL-30, received 9/5/08).

### Spread D

- 1) Commence construction between the north side of County Road 400S (MP 295.5) and the south side of County Road 500S at MP 296.7, including MLV-15 (see attached drawings D-1280-105-109; SHPO concurrence on report REX-EAST-IN-45, received 9/25/08); and
- 2) On August 17, 2008, Rockies Express requested notice to proceed with construction across from MPs 299.4 to 301.1; however the NTP received on September 23 granted construction from MPs 299.6 to 301.1. Rockies Express request to commence construction between the west side of Mud Creek (MP 299.4) to the swale in the middle of tract IN-HE-236.000 (MP 299.6) (see attached drawing 1280-D-105-110).

To summarize, Rockies Express requests approval to construct across the following areas:

- The western boundary of tract MO-PI-038.000 (MP 29.4) and the eastern boundary of tract MO-PI-038.000 (MP 29.6);
- The western boundary of tract IL-PK-034.000 (MP 51.1) and the field ditch and exclusion fencing for the sensitive resource starting at the center of tract IL-PK-034.000 (MP 51.3);
- The north side of County Road 400S (MP 295.5) and the south side of County Road 500S at MP 296.7, including MLV-15; and
- The west side of Mud Creek (MP 299.4) to the swale in the middle of tract IN-HE-236.000 (MP 299.6).

Rockies Express also requests approval for use of the travel lane between:

 MPs 51.3 to 51.6 where the sensitive resource site will be fenced and the area will be crossed using a travel lane as shown in the Illinois SHPO approved Illinois Treatment Plan No. 3 (REX-EAST-IL-30).

Rockies Express requests approval of these areas as soon as possible due to construction activities which would require a move around if timely approval is not granted. Please direct any questions with respect to this request for authorization to proceed to Ryan Childs at (307) 760-5635.



We are in receipt of Illinois Treatment Plan No. 3; Pike, Scott, and Douglas Counties; Illinois Rockies Express Pipeline-East (REX-East) Project submitted on your behalf by Commonwealth Cultural Resources Group, Inc. It is understood that archaeological site 11PK1664 will be avoided by the proposed pipeline through a re-route and that the proposed undertaking will have no effect on these sites.

The Data Recovery plans for archaeological sites 11PK1791/11PK1792, 11PK1759, 11ST540/11ST541, 11DO201, and 11E151 are acceptable to this office and may be carried out at your convenience. It should be noted that bisecting cultural features and potential cultural features as opposed to initially excavating one-quarter of features also is acceptable to this office.

Re: Phase II testing results for sites 12He294, 12He347, 12Fr333, 12Fr334, 12Fr377, 12Fr472, and 12Fr481 pertaining to the Rockies Express Pipeline LLC's installation of a 622 mile long natural gas pipeline through Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio (FERC Docket #PF06-30-000; DHPA#1562)

#### Dear Ms. Krause:

Pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. § 470f) and 36 C.F.R. Part 800, the staff of the Indiana State Historic Preservation Officer ("Indiana SHPO") has conducted an analysis of the materials received on August 26, 2008, for the above indicated project in Hendricks and Franklin counties, Indiana.

In terms of archaeological resources in the phase II reports, we concur with the recommendations that sites 12He347, 12Fr377, and 12Fr472 are eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. Therefore, these sites must be avoided by all project activities or subjected to Phase III data recovery. It is our understanding that site 12He347 will be avoided by all project activities as per Treatment Plan 2. If avoidance is not feasible, a plan for the archaeological investigations must be submitted to the Department of Natural Resources for review and comment prior to the initiation of fieldwork. The investigations must be done in accordance with the "Secretary of the Interior's Standards and Guidelines for Archaeology and Historic Preservation" (48 F.R. 44716).

We also concur that sites 12He294, 12Fr333, 12Fr334, and 12Fr481 do not appear eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. Therefore, no further archaeological investigations are necessary for these sites. If any archaeological artifacts or human remains are uncovered during construction, demolition, or earthmoving activities, state law (Indiana Code 14-21-1-27 and 29) requires that the discovery must be reported to the Department of Natural Resources within two (2) business days. In that event, please call (317) 232-1646. Be advised that adherence to Indiana Code 14-21-1-27 and 29 does not obviate the need to adhere to applicable federal statutes and regulations.

We appreciate the levels of effort for identifying and evaluating cultural resources for this project and look forward to continuing our review. A copy of the revised 36 C.F.R. Part 800 that went into effect on August 5, 2004, may be found on the Internet at www.achp.gov for your reference.
