I am writing this letter to you to express my support for AEP Ohio's Electric Security Plan (ESP). Southgate Corporation is a real estate development company which has developed industrial properties in central Ohio for over 40 years. We have developed four industrial parks in the Central Ohio area, all served by AEP.

In 1968 Southgate began developing speculative industrial buildings for manufacturing use. AEP was an excellent partner for us, mainly because they recognized the importance of bringing new manufacturing companies to Ohio. It was a joint effort on the part of the community, AEP and Southgate to find companies to locate in these buildings. Our largest park, the Newark Ohio Industrial Park, has grown to 600 acres and now includes 47 buildings employing 4,800 people.
