Good evening. The Mid Ohio Regional Planning Commission – also known as MORPC – along with the Center for Energy & Environment at MORPC would like to express support for the Columbia Gas of Ohio's Demand Side Management and WarmChoice programs as you consider the company's rate increase proposal. If you are not familiar with MORPC, we are a voluntary association of 45 local governments in central Ohio with programs, planning and services spanning 12 counties in the Columbus metropolitan region. Our Center for Energy & Environment was launched in 2007 to address the new environmental and energy challenges facing our region and country through innovative and collaborative partnerships, programs and policies.

Columbia Gas' promotion and funding of these very vital and necessary programs are an important component of the rate increase proposal, and I would like to share with you this evening about how this will benefit Ohio residents, local communities and our state's quality of life and economy.

First, MORPC's interest in energy efficiency goes back over 20 years, as we have been operating the WarmChoice program in Franklin County since 1987. The WarmChoice program is a home weatherization program for low-income customers. Program clients receive an energy audit and services that reduce their energy usage such as replacement of old furnances and putting insulation in their home. These services have been documented to provide an average of 23 percent reduction on clients' energy bills which can add up to approximately \$325 per year in savings.

These programs also directly support a major goal of MORPC's Public Policy Agenda: to promote energy efficiency and conservation. I think it is important to note that MORPC's Public Policy Agenda is shaped by members of our Central Ohio Regional Policy Roundtable, which is a group of diverse interests and representation from the 12 county region including local government, business, non-profit and education.

For our central Ohio communities, we also see implementation of energy efficiency measures as an important strategy to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and to achieve air quality attainment in central Ohio. It's been estimated that these measures could help reduce carbon dioxide emissions into Ohio's air by nearly 458,000 tons.

The other component of Columbia Gas' plan to invest millions in improving its natural gas pipeline system in Ohio will be good for jobs and for the environment, which are meaningful and significant benefits to our local governments and their residents.

Recently, we served on the DSM Stakeholder Group for Columbia Gas of Ohio. We are excited to see that WarmChoice will be expanded and new programs will be created to serve all residential, commercial and industrial customers- including assistance to our members which are searching for ways to reduce energy use and expenditure of tax payers dollars. The expeditious authorization of these energy efficiency programs will allow us, as a WarmChoice provider, to better prepare for ramping up our service delivery in 2009. I would like to share with you're a few of the many benefits of the WarmChoice program and its energy conservation efforts:

- Helps our state address energy security and global warming.
