ENTRY

The Commission finds:

- (1) The Toledo Edison Company (TE) and Tricounty Rural Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Tricounty) are electric suppliers as defined in Section 4933.81, Revised Code.
- (2) Certification by the Commission of the territories of TE and Tricounty was approved by entries in Case No. 78-1311-EL-ORD.
- (3) TE and Tricounty have jointly petitioned the Commission to reallocate their service territories in Liberty Township, Henry County, Ohio. Specifically, they request the following relocation:

Modification of Quadrangle map C-7 as represented and highlighted on the map attached to the petition. Located in Henry County, within Liberty Township, beginning at a point on the existing boundary line, extend Tricounty's boundary line southeast to intersect Township Road 8C 1,110 feet north of the centerline of US 24, continue new boundary line due east, parallel to US 24 until 800 feet west of County Road 8, continue new boundary line due north, parallel to County Road 8 for 4,183 feet, continue new boundary line due east parallel to County Road 5, and continue new boundary line due north until it connects with existing boundary line south of County Road 5.

- (4) In support of their request, TE and Tricounty state that a portion of Township Road 8C will be abandoned in connection with the widening and relocation of US 24, and the creation of a new wetlands north of US 24. TE's distribution facilities adjacent to

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the abandoned portion of Township Road 8C will be removed as part of this process, thereby making it impracticable and uneconomic to extend new distribution facilities to serve two TE customers located north of the wetlands area and the relocated US 24. Petitioners assert that it would be more economic for these customers to be served by facilities from Tricounty.

- (5) Section 4933.83(E), Revised Code, provides in pertinent part:

Notwithstanding the effectuation of certified territories established by or pursuant to sections 4933.81 to 4933.90 of the Revised Code, and the exclusive right of electric suppliers to serve within such territory, and notwithstanding any other provisions of such sections establishing rights of electric suppliers to furnish electric service, any two or more electric suppliers may jointly petition the commission for the reallocation of their own territories and electric load centers among them and designating which portions of such territories and electric load centers are to be served by each of the electric suppliers.

- (6) No objections to the reallocation described in Finding (3) have been brought to the Commission's attention.
- (7) The Commission finds that granting the requested relief will promote the purposes of Sections 4933.81 to 4933.90, Revised Code, and will further promote the provision of adequate service to all territories and electric load centers affected by the relocation as required by Section 4933.83(E), Revised Code. Accordingly, the Commission finds that the joint petition is reasonable and should be approved.
- (8) The Commission, therefore, directs that the territorial boundaries of TE and Tricounty be appropriately modified as delineated in Finding (3), and amends the maps of the certified territories accordingly.


It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the request of TE and Tricounty to relocate their territory boundaries is granted. It is, further,


ORDERED, That the change on quadrangle map C-7, described in Finding (3), be approved to show the boundary line change. It is, further,


