## **ENTRY**

The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) On August 4, 2008, Frank Klanac filed a complaint with the Commission against CenturyTel of Ohio, Inc. (CenturyTel). In the complaint, Mr. Klanac (complainant) alleged that CenturyTel caused damage to his property by drilling through his drain tile to install an anchor for two guy wires.
- (2) On August 22, 2008, CenturyTel filed an answer and motion to dismiss denying the allegations in the complaint.
- (3) On September 30, 2008, a settlement conference was held in an attempt to informally resolve this matter. The parties were unable to reach a resolution of the issue presented in the complaint. Further, it appears that reasonable grounds for complaint have been presented.
- (4) Accordingly, a hearing in this matter should be scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m. on June 25, 2009, in the offices of the Commission, Hearing Room 11-G, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793.
- (5) In Commission proceedings, the complainant has the burden of proving the allegations in the complaint. Thus, at hearing, it shall be the complainant's responsibility to appear and be prepared to present evidence in support of the complaint.
