Prairie View II Plant is a 3.2MW landfill gas to energy facility owned by Wabash Valley Power Association and operated by Waste Management. The output of the facility is verified by a billing grade bi-directional metering system. The facility is connected to a Northern Indiana Public Service Company (NIPSCO) distribution circuit and offsets our total load in the NIPSCO service area. Wabash Valley and NIPSCO have an interconnection agreement in place dated 7/31/07 specifically for this facility. The facility consists of four Caterpillar 3516 engine-generators. It is operated as a baseload facility, designed to operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The heat input per engine is 8.9 MMBtu/hr. The power is generated at 4160 Volts and stepped up via a transformer to 12,470 Volts. The landfill gas supply is supplied under a 20 year agreement with the landfill and produced by decomposing refuse. The active gas extraction system collects landfill gas via wells and pipe header system. The gas is filtered, dried and compressed to 5 psi. The heat content is approximately 550 Btu per cubic foot. The meter used is a GE Phase 3. Pictures are attached of the basic facilities.

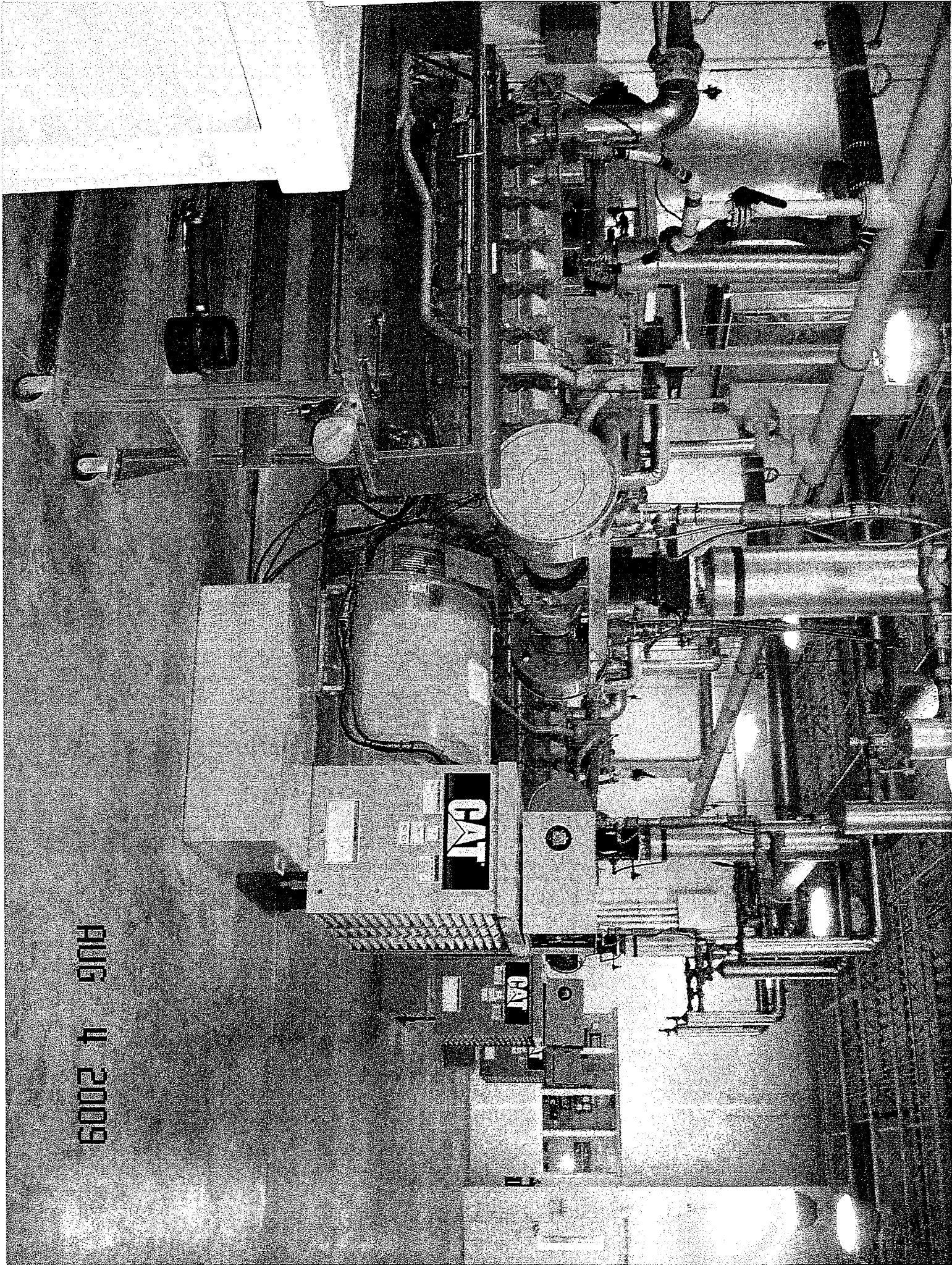

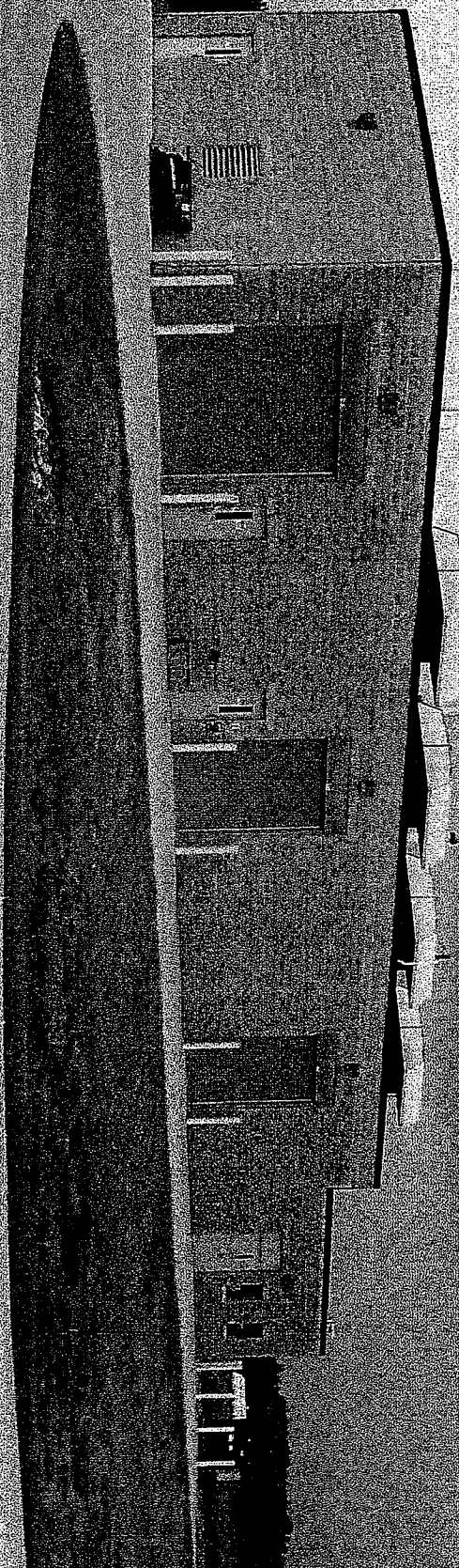

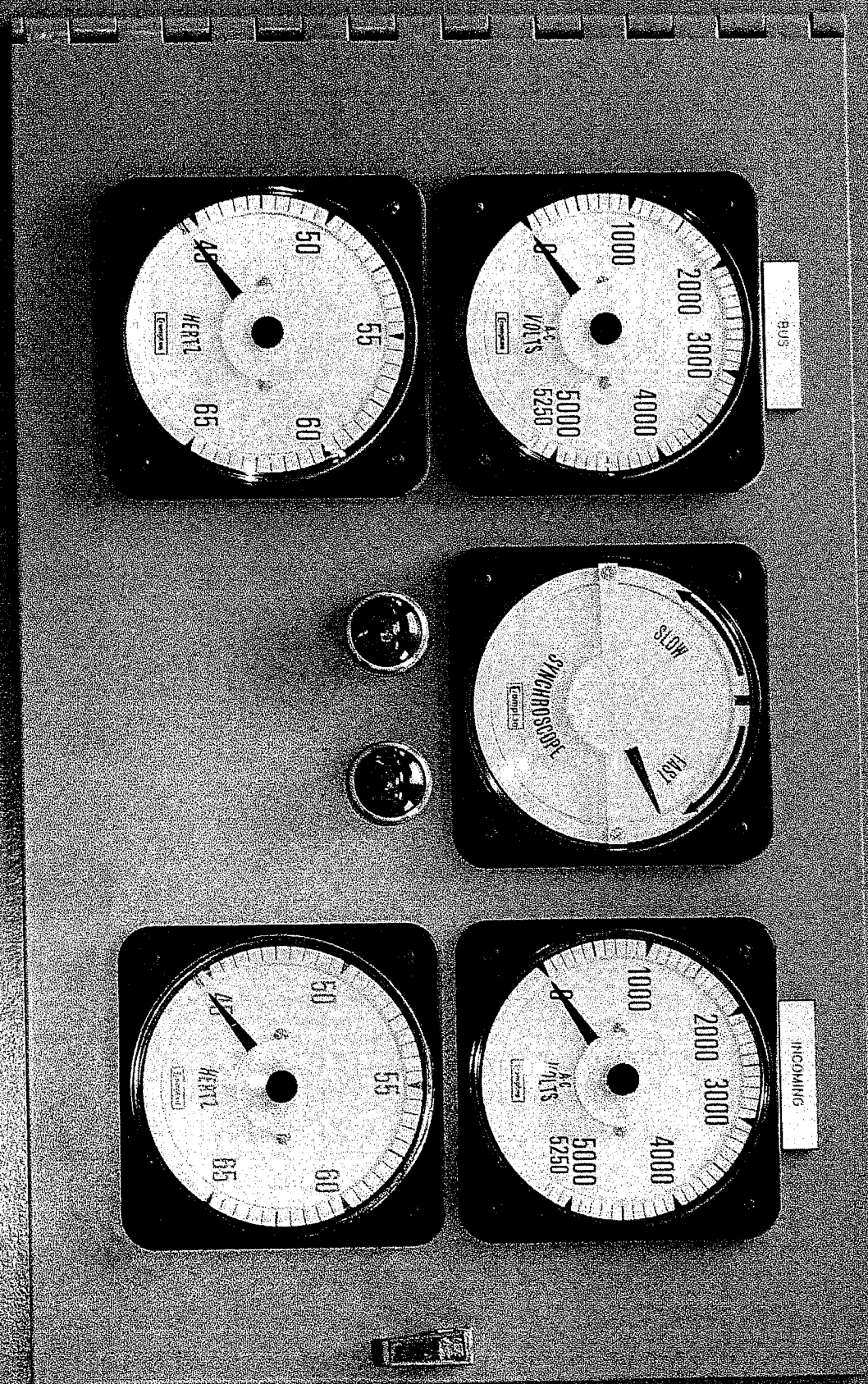
