FINDING AND ORDER

The Commission finds:

(1) On July 31, 2009, Cincinnati Bell Extended Territories (Applicant) filed an application seeking authority from the Commission to revise its Ohio Tariff P.U.C.O. No. 1 to introduce Private Switch/Automatic Location Identification (PS/ALI). PS/ALI is an Enhanced 911 service offering which allows a private telephone switch, Private Branch Exchange (PBX), or other telephone service switch located on the customer premises to be trunked directly into an E911 tandem office, delivering the number and location of the PBX end user to the appropriate Public Safety Answering Point.

The PS/ALI service is only available to multi-tenant customers and to customers in a campus environment. The PS/ALI system enables the customer to interface with a third-party vendor's software which updates an E911 database. Through the interface, the customer is able to enter and request that the Applicant update the 911 database for the specific address and location of each extension or station. Applicant is providing this service as an enhancement to its current customer base.

- (2) After reviewing Applicant's application, the Commission concludes that Applicant should be granted authority to provide PS/ALI.
- (3) This application has been filed pursuant to Section 4909.18, Revised Code, and the Commission finds, as the Applicant alleges, that it is not for an increase in any rate, joint rate, toll, classification, charge, or rental and does not appear to be unjust or unreasonable and should be approved. Therefore, the Commission finds it unnecessary to hold a hearing in this matter.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That this application be approved. It is, further,

ORDERED, That Applicant is authorized to file complete copies of tariffs in final form consistent with this finding and order. Applicant shall file one copy in its TRF docket (or may make such filing electronically as described in Case No. 06-900-AU-WVR), and one copy in this case docket. It is, further,

ORDERED, That the effective date of the new tariff should be a date not earlier than both the date of this Finding and Order and the date upon which three complete printed copies of final tariffs are filed with the Commission. The new tariff shall be effective for services rendered on or after such effective date. It is, further,

ORDERED, That nothing in this Finding and Order shall be binding upon this Commission in any subsequent investigation or proceeding involving the justness or reasonableness of any rate, charge, rule, or regulation. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Finding and Order be served upon Applicant.
