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13.0 <u>Long Distance Service</u>

13.1 General

The Company offers WATS and MTS intrastate interLATA long distance service utilizing switched or dedicated access arrangements between the Customer's Premises and the Company's facilities for call origination. Call termination is completed through a combination of the Company's facilities and LEC switched access arrangements.

13.2. Timing of Calls


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- 1. Long distance usage charges are based on the actual usage of the Company network. Chargeable time begins when a connection is established between the Calling Station and the Called Station. Chargeable time ends when either party "hangs up" thereby releasing the network connection.
- 2. Unless otherwise specified in this Tariff, the minimum call duration for billing purposes is sixty (60) seconds. In addition, unless otherwise specified in this Tariff, usage is measured thereafter in sixty (60) second increments and rounded to the next higher sixty (60) second period.

13.3 <u>Minimum Call Completion Rate</u>

A Customer can expect a call completion rate of not less than 90% during peak use periods for all Feature Group D services.

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13.4 Message Telecommunications Services

Message Telecommunications services consist of the furnishing of message telephone service between stations located within the state.
