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EXAMINER PIRIK: The Commission has called for hearing at this time and place case numbers 07-974-EL-UNC and 07-975-EL-UNC, applications filed by Duke Energy-Ohio regarding the establishment of rates for the fuel and purchased power component as well as the system reliability tracker for the market-based standard service offer.

My name is Christine Pirik. I am the attorney-examiner with the Commission who has been assigned to hear this case. We will begin by taking appearances on behalf of the parties.
