On or about October 20, 2009, the agreements for Suburban Natural Gas Company ("Suburban") to provide natural gas services to customers in the Villages of Deshler, Holgate, Hamler and Hoytville (collectively "Subject Villages") expire. ¹ Until long term arrangements can be made to provide the Subject Villages customers with natural gas services, Suburban has proposed to the Subject Villages an interim arrangement to provide natural gas services to Subject Villages customers under the terms of Suburban's Tariff filed at the Commission.

Please find enclosed a copy of correspondence requesting that the Subject Villages enact ordinances that would authorize Suburban to provide natural gas service to Subject Villages customers after October 20, 2009. Also, enclosed is the model ordinance drafted by Suburban's counsel that was attached to the correspondence sent to each of the Subject Villages.

¹ Suburban is also seeking abandonment of the Village of Malinta customers ("Malinta") in this proceeding. However, because Suburban's existing agreement to provide Malinta with natural gas services does not expire until May of 2012, Suburban has not yet proposed to serve Malinta under the terms of Suburban's Tariff.

ORDINANCE NO._____

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SUBURBAN NATURAL GAS COMPANY TO TEMPORARILY CONTINUE TO PROVIDE NATURAL GAS SERVICE WITHIN THE VILLAGE

WHEREAS, for a period of almost fifty (50) years, Suburban Natural Gas Company and its predecessors ("Suburban") leased a natural gas distribution system from the Village of ______

______, Ohio, ("Village"), as well as the Village's interest in an integrated natural gas transmission system ("Transmission System"), and under the same agreement, provided Village residents, businesses and other premises ("Customers") natural gas service ("Lease Agreement");

WHEREAS, the Village, along with a number of other Northwestern Ohio Villages (collectively "Subject Villages"), hold interests in the Transmission System designed to provide natural gas services to Customers located within the Subject Villages;

WHEREAS, Suburban also leases each of the Subject Village's natural gas distribution systems as well as each's interest in the Transmission System, and provides natural gas services to the Subject Villages' customers in accordance to the terms and conditions of agreements similar to the Lease Agreement;

WHEREAS, the similar lease agreements between Suburban and the Subject Villages are expiring and have also not been renewed;

WHEREAS, the Lease Agreement expires on ______ of _____

WHEREAS, the Village and Suburban have not renewed the Lease Agreement nor have the Village and Suburban entered into an agreement to supply natural gas to the Customers beyond the expiration of the Lease Agreement;

WHEREAS, Suburban has filed an application at the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("PUCO"), in PUCO Case No. 08-947-GA-ABN, seeking PUCO authority for Suburban to

abandon any obligation to provide natural gas service to Customers after the Lease Agreement expires as well as those customers in the Subject Villages;

WHEREAS, the Village is currently determining how and by whom natural gas will be supplied to Customers located in the Village beyond the expiration of the Lease Agreement and the temporary arrangements provided herein;

WHEREAS, upon expiration of the Lease Agreement, and as a temporary measure in order to provide the Village sufficient time to make other arrangements for the supply of natural gas to customers located within the Village, Suburban has offered, and the Village should authorize Suburban, to supply natural gas to Customers located within the Village under the terms and conditions of Suburban's tariff on file at the PUCO ("Tariff"), as the same may be modified from time to time, continuing until either further agreement of the parties or action by the PUCO.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF ______, OHIO:

SECTION 1: That all natural gas services rendered by Suburban on or after the date the Lease Agreement expires to Customers shall be rendered in accordance with the rates, terms and conditions contained in Suburban's then effective tariff on file with the PUCO, as the same may be amended from time to time.

SECTION 2: That subsequent to the expiration of the Lease Agreement and upon written acceptance of this Ordinance by Suburban, any continuing obligation of Suburban to serve Customers shall be governed by Suburban's PUCO tariff and Orders of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio in Case No. 08-947-GA-ABN, or another applicable case, unless superseded by a subsequent written agreement between Suburban and the Village.

SECTION 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Village Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in conformance with applicable open meetings laws and that all deliberations of this Village Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in compliance with all legal requirements including any applicable open meetings requirements. SECTION 4: This Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the Village and its citizens, and is hereby declared an emergency measure in that it is necessary to preserve the welfare of the Village and its citizens to assume the uninterrupted continuation of natural gas service to the Village and its citizens and shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.
