## The Commission finds:

- (1) On September 25, 2009, Charles F. Carr (complainant) filed a complaint against Toledo Edison Company (TE), questioning his electric service and the rate at which he is charged. Specifically, complainant states that he is billed as a non-residential consumer for a single pump, which drains a 40 acre agricultural field. Complainant asserts that he should not be billed as a non-residential consumer for his agricultural electric use. Complainant requests that he be billed at a residential rate or, in the alternative, that TE establish a separate agricultural rate schedule.
- (2) On October 15, 2009, TE filed its answer to the complaint, as well as a motion to dismiss, denying the allegations in the complaint, and stating that TE has not violated any rule, regulation, or tariff provision. TE also asserts that the complainant has failed to set forth reasonable grounds for the complaint.
- (3) By letter filed on December 1, 2009, complainant expressed his desire to withdraw his complaint.
- (4) The Commission finds that the complainant's request to withdraw his complaint is reasonable and should be granted.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That complainant's request to withdraw his complaint be granted. It is, further,

ORDERED, That Case No. 09-864-EL-CSS be dismissed. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this entry be served upon all parties of record.
