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Planners expect they will be built by the end of 2012 or later. Supporters said they would create 34,000 temporary

and permanent jobs.

Gov. Ted Strickland was disappointed the issue passed.

I think if the economy was not facing these recessionary pressures that it would proba-bly not have passed," Strickland said. "But people are hungry for jobs, and the promise of jobs was what caused

them to support this."

Voters' nod to gambling came on the heels of seven consecutive months of increases to state unemployment that saw the rate reach double digits before topping out at 11.2 percent in July. Few industries were immune from job losses, with service, administrative and manufacturing areas losing the most as the rate climbed.

But Cleveland economist George Zeller said in March that some parts of the state, including Columbus and Cleveland, lost more jobs in finance and insurance than in manufacturing.

"What this means is that we have two major problems in the economy here in Ohio, and this has never happened before, at least since the '30s," he said.



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
# **Notice of Proposed** Major Utility Facility (Wind Farm)

### **FACILITY DESCRIPTION**

Hardin Wind Energy LLC, an affiliate of Invenergy Wind Development LLC, has an amended application pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board, Case No. 09-479-EL-BGN. Its application, as amended, proposes to construct a 300 MW wind-powered electric generation facility consisting of approximately 200 1.5 MW wind turbines in the western portion of Hardin County that will spread across 23,000 acres of leased land in Hardin County. It will be located in portions of the townships of Lang Cases Medical Management of the townships of Lang Cases Medical Management of the second the townships of Lynn, Cessna, Marion, Roundhead, McDonald, and Taylor Creek. The general purpose of the project is to produce clean, renewable, reliably priced, low cost electricity to the Ohio electric marketplace, and bring dozens of new jobs to Hardin County and the surrounding area.

### **LOCATION AND GENERAL LAYOUT**

The general location and planned project layout of the Hardin Wind Farm is shown on the map below.



### APPLICATION NOW PENDING

Hardin Wind Energy LLC, an affiliate of Invenergy Wind Development LLC, has an amended application for a certificate to construct, operate, and maintain a facility now pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board. The assigned docket number for the Amended Application is Case No. 09-479-BL-BGN, and a copy can be located at the Ohio Power Siting Board website at http://www.opsb.ohio.gov then by scrolling down to "Pending Cases" and selecting the case by name or docket number.

The public hearing of this case shall consist of two parts:

- (1) A non-adjudicatory hearing, pursuant to Section 4906.08(C), Revised Code, where the Board shall accept written or oral testimony from any person on January 5, 2010, at 6:00 p.m., at the Hardin County Courthouse, Veterans Hall, One Courthouse Square, Kenton, Ohio 43226; and,
- (2) An adjudicatory hearing commencing on January 12, 2010, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, Hearing Room 11-F. 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793.

#### OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON PROPOSED FACILITY

The public will be given an opportunity to comment on the proposed facility. As noted above, the non-adjudicatory hearing will be held on January 5, 2010, at 6:00 p.m., at the Hardin County Courthouse, Veterans Hall, One Courthouse Square, Kenton, Ohio 43226.


