MOTION FOR A TWO-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE COMMENTS AND REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED RULING BY THE OFFICE OF THE OHIO CONSUMERS' COUNSEL

The Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel ("OCC"), on behalf of the residential utility consumers of the Ohio Edison Company, The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company and The Toledo Edison Company (collectively "FirstEnergy" or "Company"), moves the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("PUCO" or "Commission") for a two-day extension of time for the filing of Initial Comments, pursuant to Ohio Adm. Code 4901-1-12 and 4901-1-13(A). A two-day extension would extend the filing deadline to Friday, January 15, 2010.

Furthermore, OCC seeks an expedited ruling, which the PUCO may issue immediately, under the special provision in Ohio Adm. Code 4901-1-12(C) for extensions of five days or less. The reasons supporting this request, along with an explanation of the need to determine the filing deadline on an expedited basis, are set forth in the attached Memorandum in Support.

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR A TWO-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE TESTIMONY AND REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED RULING BY THE OFFICE OF THE OHIO CONSUMERS' COUNSEL

I. INTRODUCTION

This case affects the rates paid by the approximately 1.9 million residential customers of FirstEnergy. The Company filed its application on November 18, 2009, and asked that the Commission approve the application by December 9, 2009. OCC¹ ("OCC First Comments") and the Ohio Partners for Affordable Energy² ("OPAE") filed comments requesting the Commission to provide a due process opportunity because the application provided so little information about the program and the line item costs that FirstEnergy proposes to recover from its customers. FirstEnergy filed comments in response to OCC's First Comments on December 21, 2009. The Commission issued an Entry on December 30, 2009, seeking public comment on FirstEnergy's application. In that Entry the Commission set the filing date for Initial Comments to be January 13, 2009.

On December 17, 2009, the OCC served the Company with discovery requests in order to obtain more detailed information that would enhance the quality of the Initial Comments OCC would be able to file. The responses were due on January 6, 2010 but were not received until after business hours on January 11, 2010.

II. APPLICABLE PROCEDURAL RULES

Ohio Adm. Code 4901-1-13(A) permits parties to move for extensions of time to file testimony. That rule provides for the granting of such motions for "good cause shown."

Ohio Adm. Code 4901-1-12(C) allows parties to request an expedited ruling on their motions. If the motion requests an extension of time to file pleadings or other papers of five days or less, then the Commission or the Attorney Examiner may issue an immediate ruling without awaiting the filing of a memorandum contra.³

III. ARGUMENT

OCC seeks a two-day extension of time to file Initial Comments pursuant to Ohio Adm. Code 4901-1-13(A) for good cause shown. Although OCC served discovery to FirstEnergy on a timeline that would have provided OCC sufficient time to incorporate the responses into its Initial Comments, OCC did not receive the responses until five days after the due date.

The extension of time would change the deadline for filing of Initial Comments from January 13, 2010 to January 15, 2010. In addition, in order to allow parties sufficient time to review the Initial Comments, the Commission should grant a corresponding two-day extension of time for Reply Comments. An extension of time to file Reply Comments

would make them due on Friday, January 22nd rather than on Wednesday January 24th.

OCC proposes that the extensions apply to all intervenors.

Granting this brief extension would allow OCC the needed time after FirstEnergy's

delayed discovery response to work with OCC's consultant and incorporate the data

responses where appropriate into the comments OCC is preparing. The extension has good

cause and will not cause undue delay, and should not work to prejudice any party. For these

reasons, the Commission should grant OCC's Motion for an Extension of Time to File

Comments.

Furthermore, OCC requests a ruling on this Motion on an expedited basis because

the Comments are due tomorrow and without an expedited ruling today or tomorrow.

IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, the Commission should grant OCC's Motion based

upon the OCC's showing of good cause. The Commission should grant this Motion on

an expedited basis.
