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- 4 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Let's go on the
- 5 record. The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio has
- 6 called for hearing at this time and place Case No.
- 7 09-503-EL-FOR, being in the Matter of the 2009
- 8 Electric Long-Term Forecast Report of Duke Energy
- 9 Ohio. My name is Katie Stenman, and I am the
- 10 Attorney Examiner assigned by the Commission to hear
- 11 this case.
- 12 At this time I would like to take the
- 13 appearances of the parties.
- 14 MS. PARROT: Good morning, your Honor.
- 15 On behalf of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio
- 16 Staff, Thomas W. McNamee and Sarah J. Parrot,
- 17 Assistant Attorneys General, Public Utilities
- 18 Section, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215.
- 19 And, your Honor, I am also authorized
- 20 today to proceed on behalf of and enter appearances
- 21 on behalf of Duke Energy Ohio, Inc., by Amy B.
- 22 Spiller, Associate General Counsel, and Elizabeth H.
- 23 Watts, Assistant General Counsel, 155 East Broad
- 24 Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215.
- 25 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you very much.

- 1 I would like to note for the record that there are no
- 2 members of the public here to testify at this time.
- I understand the parties have docketed a
- 4 stipulation?
- MS. PARROT: Yes, that's correct, your
- 6 Honor. The Stipulation and Recommendation was filed
- 7 in the docket of this case on January 7, 2010, and I
- 8 would like to mark that as Joint Exhibit No. 1 at
- 9 this time for identification purposes.
- 10 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: It will be so marked.
- 11 (EXHIBIT MARKED FOR IDENTIFICATION.)
- MS. PARROT: Also the Staff is prepared
- 13 to offer the testimony of Daniel Johnson in support
- 14 of this stipulation, and we would call him at this
- 15 time, if necessary.
- 16 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Go ahead.
- 17 (Witness sworn.)
- 18 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Ms. Parrot.
- MS. PARROT: Thank you, your Honor.
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1 DANIEL JOHNSON

- 2 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was
- 3 examined and testified as follows:
- 4 DIRECT EXAMINATION
- 5 By Ms. Parrot:
- 6 Q. Good morning, Mr. Johnson.
- 7 A. Good morning.
- 8 Q. Would you please state your full name and
- 9 your businesses address for the record.
- 10 A. My name is Daniel R. Johnson. My place
- 11 of business is the Public Utilities Commission of
- 12 Ohio at 180 East Broad Street.
- Q. And what is your role with the Public
- 14 Utilities Commission?
- 15 A. I am the chief of the planning and market
- 16 analysis division of the energy environment
- 17 department. That division is responsible for
- 18 reviewing the electric utility forecast filings.
- 19 Q. Thank you. Could you please give us a
- 20 brief description of your education and other
- 21 relevant work experience.
- 22 A. I have been the chief of this particular
- 23 division for approximately 10 or 11 years. My
- 24 education includes a Master's in business
- 25 administration from the University of Pittsburgh and

- 1 Master's in energy resources also from the University
- 2 of Pittsburgh.
- 3 Q. Thank you very much. Are you familiar
- 4 with the Stipulation and Recommendation that's been
- 5 marked as Joint Exhibit No. 1 in this proceeding?
- A. I am indeed.
- 7 Q. And are you also familiar with the
- 8 three-part test for evaluating stipulations that the
- 9 Commission uses?
- 10 A. Yes, I am.
- 11 Q. And let's have you please refer to Joint
- 12 Exhibit No. 1 at this time. Do you believe that this
- 13 settlement is the product of serious bargaining among
- 14 capable, knowledgeable parties?
- 15 A. Yes, I believe that is the case. There
- 16 was notice to all parties and to the public that this
- 17 matter was set for hearing and that the filing has
- 18 been posted on the Docketing Information System and
- 19 the stipulation, and so the public is aware through
- 20 our normal channels that all -- the forecast has been
- 21 filed and that the stipulation has been filed.
- 22 Q. Thank you. Were all parties represented
- 23 by able counsel to your knowledge?
- A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And are there any parties that oppose the

- 1 stipulation?
- 2 A. There are no parties known to me at all
- 3 who oppose this stipulation.
- Q. And, in fact, all of the parties to this
- 5 proceeding have signed on to the stipulation; is that
- 6 correct?
- 7 A. That is correct.
- 8 Q. And based on your experience, do you
- 9 believe that the settlement as a package benefits
- 10 ratepayers and is in the public's interest?
- 11 A. I absolutely believe that. The package
- 12 avoids unnecessary litigation and associated costs.
- 13 Q. And, finally, do you believe that the
- 14 settlement package violates any important regulatory
- 15 principle or practice?
- 16 A. No, ma'am. The -- the settlement -- the
- 17 forecast process is governed by Chapter 4935.04 of
- 18 the Ohio Revised Code. And there in Section F is
- 19 contained seven criteria for evaluating the
- 20 reasonableness of forecasts submitted by electric
- 21 utilities. Based upon review by the Staff -- by
- 22 Staff under my supervision, we believe that none of
- 23 the criteria for having a reasonable forecast is
- 24 violated.
- 25 This filing was occasioned by a

- 1 significant change from prior forecasts, and we
- 2 believe that that significant change is caused by
- 3 current economic conditions.
- 4 Q. Thank you very much. Based on your
- 5 experience do you recommend that the Commission adopt
- 6 this Stipulation and Recommendation that's marked as
- 7 Joint Exhibit 1?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 MS. PARROT: Thank you very much.
- I have no further questions for the
- 11 witness, your Honor.
- 12 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Seeing as I have
- 13 none, please step down.
- 14 THE WITNESS: Thank you.
- MS. PARROT: At this time I would move
- 16 for the admission of Joint Exhibit No. 1.
- 17 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Joint Exhibit No. 1
- 18 will be admitted.
- 19 (EXHIBIT ADMITTED INTO EVIDENCE.)
- 20 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Is there anything
- 21 else to come before us today?
- MS. PARROT: I do not believe so, your
- 23 Honor.
- 24 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: All right. If there
- 25 is nothing further, that concludes this hearing and

1	the case will be submitted on the record. We're
2	adjourned.
