### PETITION OF CINCINNATI BELL EXTENDED TERRITORIES LLC FOR REVIEW OF A DECISION OF THE POOLING ADMINISTRATOR

Cincinnati Bell Extended Territories LLC ("CBET") hereby requests that the Commission review and overturn a decision of the number Pooling Administrator ("PA"), which denied a CBET request for numbering resources. On April 6, 2010, CBET filed a request with the PA for a thousands-block of numbers (1,000 numbers) within the Beavercreek rate center to meet a specific customer request that CBET was unable to satisfy with its existing numbering resources. The PA denied CBET's request on the grounds that CBET has not satisfied the months-to-exhaust and utilization criteria established in the Central Office Code Assignment Guidelines. Under the federal numbering rules, a state commission may overturn the PA's decision based on its determination that the carrier has demonstrated a verifiable need for the numbering resources and has exhausted all other available remedies. For the reasons set forth below, CBET submits that the Commission is justified in overturning the PA's decision and granting CBET's request for a new thousands-block.

The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), in its Third Report and Order in the Numbering Resource Optimization proceeding, found that "a carrier should be able to get additional numbering resources when there is a verifiable need due to the

carrier's inability to satisfy a specific customer request."<sup>2</sup> It also clarified that states may grant requests by carriers in such circumstances, as long as the request is for a customer seeking contiguous blocks of numbers and not vanity numbers.<sup>3</sup> Therefore, this Commission has the authority to overturn the PA's decisions under the appropriate circumstances.

In the immediate case, CBET has a request from Coldwell Banker Heritage Realtors (see Attachment A) for 70 contiguous numbers to replace its existing numbers. The numbers currently in use at Coldwell Banker's corporate offices are from the 937-912 NXX. As explained in the accompanying letter, Coldwell Banker often finds that agents and others calling Coldwell Banker inadvertently dial 911 instead of 912. This misdialing triggers a call to the E911 operator and frequently results in a dispatch of emergency personnel to the calling party's location. In order to eliminate these unnecessary and unintended emergency dispatches, Coldwell Banker has requested numbers from a corresponding thousands block from another NXX. Although the numbers can be from any NXX within the Beavercreek rate center where Coldwell Banker's corporate offices are located, the customer would like the last four digits to remain the same as their existing numbers in order to ease the transition to the new numbers and minimize disruption to its business.

CBET has reviewed its numbering resources within the Beavercreek rate center and finds that it is unable to satisfy its customer's request. Although CBET does have the 937-306-1XXX block in the Beavercreek rate center, the majority of the numbers

requested by Coldwell Banker are already assigned. On April 6, CBET requested a new thousands-block from the PA to meet Coldwell Banker's request; however, the request was rejected because CBET does not meet the months to exhaust and utilization required for assignment of a new thousands block. To further assist the Commission's review, attached is a copy of CBET's request to the PA which includes the MTE and Utilization Certification Worksheet as well as the PA's response (see Attachment B).

For the reasons set forth above, CBET requests that the Commission overturn the PA's decision and direct the PA to grant CBET's request for a thousands-block to satisfy the needs of its customer.

To Whom It May Concern:

We are a Cincinnati Bell customer for local service in all of our offices.

Our Corporate Office at 4060 Executive, Beavercreek, OH 45430 is currently assigned DID numbers within the 937-912-1130 through 937-912-1200 range.

The problem that we face is that when agents from other offices within our company go to call us, many times, they inadvertently dial 911, instead of 912. Too often, they hang up quickly, thinking that our phone system won't send that call through. However, for safety concerns, it does complete the call. Consequently, police and emergency personnel are dispatched to the office that the call originated from.

To eliminate this problem, we are hereby requesting the assignment of the same contiguous range of numbers from a new NXX. Specifically, the area code must be (937), the exchange should be local to Beavercreek, Ohio and the last four digits should be contiguous between 1130 and 1200. By mirroring the last four digits of our existing DIDs we will be able ease the transition to the new numbers and minimize the disruption to our business.

#### Instructions for filling out each Section of the Part 1A form:

Section 1.1 Contact information requires that Service Providers supply under "Block Applicant" the company name, company headquarters address, a contact within the company, an address where the contact person may be reached, in addition to the correct phone, fax, and e-mail address. The Pooling Administrator section also requires the Service Provider to fill in the Pooling Administrator's name, address, phone, fax and e-mail.

Section 1.2 Service Providers who need a thousands-block assignment or for an Location Routing Number (LRN) are required to fill in this section. If needed for an LRN, a CO Code Application needs to also be submitted to the PA. The Service Provider should supply the Numbering Plan Area (NPA); the Local Access Transport Area (LATA), which is a three-digit number that can be found in the Telcordia<sup>TM</sup> LERG<sup>TM</sup> Routing Guide. The Operating Company Number (OCN) assigned to the service provider and the OCN its parent company. An OCN is a four-character alphanumeric assigned by Telcordia<sup>TM</sup> Routing Administration (TRA). In addition, the number of thousands-blocks requested should be supplied. The Switch Identification as well as the city or wire center name, rate center, rate center sub zone, homing tandem and CLLI TM tandem of the facilities based provider Xi. Explanations of these terms may be found in the footnotes.

Section 1.3 The date the Service Provider completes the application should be entered in this section, as well as the Effective Date of the requested thousands-block.

Section 1.4 Service Providers should indicate their type, e.g., local exchange carrier, competitive local exchange carrier, interexchange carrier, CMRS. The also indicate the primary type of business in which the numbering resource is to be used. Service Providers also may indicate their preference for a particular thousands-block, e.g., 321-9XXX, or indicate any thousands-blocks that may be undesirable, e.g., 321-6XXX.

Section 1.5 Service Providers indicate the type of request, Initial requests are for first applications for thousands-blocks in a rate center, growth for additional thousands-blocks in a rate center in which the applicant already has numbering resources, and provide the required evidence as ordered by the FCC.

The thousands-block applicant certifies veracity of this form by signing their name, and providing their title and date.

Section 1.6 Service Providers must indicate the updated/current information in regards to contaminated TNs on the block they are returning to the pool. Blocks with over 10% contamination (101 TNs or more) shall not be returned to the pool unless they meet criteria outlined in section 9.1.2 of these Guidelines. If the block being returned is over 10% contaminated the PA shall seek a new block holder. If question c and/or d have a response of No, the request for return shall be denied.


