#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### TOMAHAWK UTILITIES, INC.

#### NOTE A - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The records of the utility are maintained using the 1976 uniform system of accounts for Class C water utilities as adopted by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO).

The rates charged to customers by the utility are subject to the requirements of PUCO.

The Company supplies water to the property owners around Tomahawk Lake located in Columbiana County, Ohio. Accounts receivable are from these customers.

Utility Plant is stated at cost less depreciation computed by the straight-line method, using lives ranging from 10 to 80 years.

Repair and maintenance costs are expensed as incurred.

The Company accounts for income taxes in accordance with FASB ASC 740-10 "Accounting for Income Taxes" (SFAS 109) which requires the use of the "liability method" of accounting for income taxes. Accordingly, deferred tax liabilities and assets are determined based on the difference between the financial statement and tax basis of assets and liabilities, using enacted tax rates in effect for the year in which the differences are expected to reverse. Under this method of valuation, an allowance has been recognized to offset deferred taxes.

Customers' construction deposits are being amortized by the straight-line method using a life of 80 years.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

For presentation on the balance sheet and statement of cash flows, highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less are considered to be cash equivalents.

#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

#### NOTE B - CONTINUING OPERATIONS

As a result of operating losses for prior years, the Company's total liabilities exceed its total assets as of December 31, 2009 and 2008.

The Company will continue to rely on related parties for financial assistance. See Note D.

#### NOTE C - FEDERAL TAXES ON INCOME

The Company has a net operating loss carryforward of approximately \$173,755 that may be offset against future taxable income, expiring in future years through 2029.

For the years December 31, 2009 and 2008, respectively, the net deferred tax asset is calculated as follows:

Uncertain Tax Positions. The Company adopted the provisions of FASB ASC 740-10, Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes, (FIN 48) on January 1, 2009. The provisions prescribe a two-step process for recognizing and measuring income tax uncertainties. First, a threshold condition of "more likely than not" should be met to determine whether any of the benefit from an uncertain tax position should be recognized in the financial statements. If the recognition threshold is met, FASB ASC 740-10 (FIN 48) provides additional guidance on measuring the amount of the uncertain tax position. The Company may recognize a tax benefit from an uncertain tax position under FASB ASC 740-10 (FIN 48) only if it is more likely than not that the tax position will be sustained on examination by taxing authorities based on the technical merits of the position. The tax benefit recognized in the financial statements from an uncertain position should be measured under FASB ASC 740-10 (FIN 48) based on the largest benefit that has a greater than 50% likelihood of being realized

upon ultimate settlement. FASB ASC 740-10 (FIN 48) also provides guidance on derecognition, classification, transition and increased disclosure of uncertain tax positions. The Company recognized no liability for unrecognized tax benefits resulting from the adoption of FASB ASC 740-10 (FIN 48) for the initial application date and as of December 31, 2009.

Prior to January 1, 2009 the Company elected to defer the application of FIN 48 in accordance with FIN 48-3, Effective Date of FASB Interpretation No. 48 for Certain Nonpublic Enterprises issued and effective December 30, 2008.

For the year ended December 31, 2008 the Company used a FAS 5, Loss Contingencies, approach for evaluating uncertain tax positions.

The offices of the utility are located in a building owned by the shareholders. Rent is payable monthly for this office space and totaled \$3,600 in 2009 and 2008.

Interest paid on the outstanding payables to related parties was \$4,694 and \$4,594 in 2009 and 2008, respectively.

#### NOTE E - PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENT

As a result of an internal review of rate case 05-1579-WW-AIR presented by the Public Utility Commission of Ohio, the Company restated the amortization on customer construction deposits in accordance with the commission's recommendation. As a result, beginning accumulated amortization as of January 1, 2008 was increased by \$19,404 with a corresponding reduction to (deficits) retained in the business. There was no material effect for the years ended December 31, 2009 and 2008. Due to significant net operating loss carry forwards the tax effects were not calculated.
