Now comes the City of Grandview Heights ("Grandview Heights"), and moves the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio or its Attorney Examiner to extend the expiration date of Grandview Heights' Certificate No. 06-116(2), which authorizes it to provide natural gas to its constituents as an Ohio government aggregator. The certificate expired on July 3, 2010 and Grandview Heights seeks to extend the expiration date until September 18, 2010 to allow for the 30-day review process of its renewal application, which was filed on August 18, 2010.

WHEREFORE, Grandview Heights respectfully requests that the Commission grant its motion to extend the expiration date of Certificate No. 06-116(2) from July 3, 2010 to September 18, 2010.

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MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

The City of Grandview Heights ("Grandview Heights") was issued Certificate No. 06-116(2) it to provide natural gas to its constituents as an Ohio government aggregator for the two-year period commencing July 3, 2008 and ending July 3, 2010. Unfortunately, due to the unavailability of certain management and an inadvertent administrative error, Grandview Heights filed its renewal application on August 18, 2010, 75 days after the June 3, 2010 filing deadline. The Commission has now received a filed copy of Grandview Heights' 2010 renewal application. There have been no material changes in Grandview Heights' business practices as defined in Rule 4901:1:1-24-10 of the Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC").

Grandview Heights respectfully requests that the Commission extend Certificate No. 06-116(2) to September 18, 2010. Grandview Heights apologizes for this administrative oversight and pledges that all reports and certifications required by the Commission will be timely filed in the future.

The Commission has plenary authority to extend the expiration date of Grandview Heights' certificate for good cause shown. As demonstrated above, Grandview Heights' tardiness in filing its Renewal Application was solely due to an inadvertent administrative error. Moreover, Grandview Heights' business practices have not changed in any material respect since its last certification was filed in 2008. Consequently, Grandview Heights respectfully requests an extension of the expiration date of its certification.
