

II. MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

The City Of Parma was issued Renewal Certificate No. 00-015 (5) to provide competitive retail electric service for the two-year period commencing November 13, 2008 and ending November 13, 2010. Unfortunately, due to an inadvertent oversight with regard to the timing for filing, The City of Parma did not realize the advance filing date for its certificate renewal has passed. The City of Parma already filed its renewal application on November 9, 2010. While the Commission considers the renewal, The City of Parma requests an extension of the expiration date of its certificate from November 13, 2010 to December 13, 2010, to allow for the thirty day review period from the November 9, 2010 renewal application filing date.

The City of Parma's request is reasonable under the circumstances and should be granted. Although, The City of Parma inadvertently failed to file its renewal application 30 days prior to the expiration date, in substance there have been no material changes in The City of Parma's operation of its aggregation program. Indeed, except for the automatic expiration date of Certificate 00-015 (5), The City of Parma has done nothing that would warrant suspension or recession of its authority. Since The City of Parma's dilemma has been caused by an advertent oversight, an extension would allow The City of Parma to obtain renewal of its certificate without causing inconvenience to its residents. The City of Parma respectfully submits that an extension of its certificate expiration date is in the public interest.
