PETITION OF CINCINNATI BELL EXTENDED TERRITORIES LLC FOR REVIEW OF A DECISION OF THE POOLING ADMINISTRATOR

Cincinnati Bell Extended Territories LLC ("CBET") hereby requests that the Commission review and overturn a decision of the number Pooling Administrator ("PA") which denied a CBET request for numbering resources. On January 25, 2011, CBET filed a request with the PA seeking an entire NXX in the Springfield rate center to meet a specific customer request that CBET was unable to satisfy with its existing numbering resources. The PA denied CBET's request on the grounds that CBET does not meet the months-to-exhaust criterion established by the Federal Communications Commission. Under the federal numbering rules, a state commission may overturn the PA's decision based on its determination that the carrier has demonstrated a verifiable need for the numbering resources and has exhausted all other available remedies. For the reasons set forth below, CBET submits that the Commission is justified in overturning the PA's decision and granting CBET's request for a new NXX to meet this customer's needs.

The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), in its Third Report and Order in the Numbering Resource Optimization proceeding, found that "a carrier should be able to get additional numbering resources when there is a verifiable need due to the

carrier's inability to satisfy a specific customer request."² It also clarified that states may grant requests by carriers in such circumstances, as long as the request is for a customer seeking contiguous blocks of numbers and not vanity numbers.³ Therefore, this Commission has the authority to overturn the PA's decisions under the appropriate circumstances.

Community Mercy Health Partners' Request

In the immediate case, CBET has a request from Community Mercy Health Partners ("CMHP") for 10,000 numbers to be used for a new hospital system it is establishing in Springfield, Ohio (see Attachment A). The new Springfield Regional Medical Center ("SRMC"), scheduled to open in November 2011, will replace two existing hospitals that currently serve the region. The 254 bed SRMC will provide a full range of inpatient and outpatient care. If needs warrant, the facility can be expanded by an additional 60 beds. As explained in the attached letter from CMHP, the new facility is designed to take full advantage of the latest technology to meet its communications needs (see Attachment A).

CMHP has requested a full NXX that will enable it to have a consistent 7-digit dialing plan for the new facility as well as a host of other related health care facilities and providers in its region. Currently, CMHP has approximately 3,500 numbers in use between the two existing hospitals, however, these numbers are scattered over four NXXs. CMHP wants to unify all of its Springfield area facilities under a single NXX in order to eliminate confusion to its patients, patients' families, doctors and staff. CMHP

anticipates using 5,000 of the new numbers immediately for the new hospital and associated medical offices. The remaining 5,000 numbers would be set aside for future needs as CMHP grows to meet the health care needs of the community.

Once the new SRMC is open and existing services are transitioned to the new NXX, CMHP will return most of its existing numbers. However, since the majority of the existing numbers have been ported to CBET from CMHP's old service provider, CBET will not retain the numbers in its inventory. In accordance with the local number portability and telephone number administration guidelines, the ported numbers will "snap back" to the original service provider.⁴

CBET has no unopened NXXs in the Springfield rate center, nor does it have any unopened thousands-blocks within the rate center. The four thousands-blocks in CBET's Springfield rate center inventory have a utilization rate of over 79%. However, as shown on the attached Pooling Administration Worksheet, its projected months-to-exhaust is greater than the maximum six months required to support a request for additional numbering resources (see Attachment B). As a result, CBET's request for an NXX to meet CMHP's needs was rejected by the PA.

Please accept this letter as a formal request for a block of 5000 consecutive DID numbers that will be used for a new hospital system in Springfield, Ohio. We would also respectively request to reserve the remaining 5000 of the exchange for a corporate dialing plan.

The need for this request is created by Catholic Health Partners continued growth and commitment to Ohio and the patients we serve. The enhancement to our facility will increase CHP's presentence by adding 254 acute care beds and further CHP's commitment to provide quality Healthcare jobs in Ohio. Furthermore, CHP is in the process of deploying Cisco IP Telephony at our inpatient facilities allowing us to eliminate high maintenance PBX equipment. These savings will be used to further our commitment to our patients by improving our advanced clinical software with the implementation of EPIC.

Community Mercy Health Partners is a comprehensive, integrated regional healthcare system, renowned for our quality, innovation, compassionate service, and culture. It was established in 2004 when The Community Hospital of Springfield and Clark County joined the larger Catholic Health Partners system which covers 5 states and is the largest not-for-profit healthcare system in Ohio.

Community Mercy Health Partners commits to carry out the Catholic Healthcare Partners mission within our community by providing safe, effective, patient/resident centered, timely and cost efficient care and education to meet the health needs of all people, especially the poor and underserved. Our commitment to this healing ministry will be evidenced by exceptional care, compassion and respect for the diverse religious beliefs and faith traditions of those we serve.

Springfield Regional Medical Center represents the culmination of this merger as we build a new state-ofthe-art facility to replace the two existing hospitals. The Medical Center will provide a full range of inpatient and outpatient care. It is opening with 254 beds but has the capability to add another floor to the patient towers and expand by an additional 60 beds if warranted. - Interactive television system via flat-screen TVs providing information, education and entertainment to patients and families
- Complete wireless coverage for telemetry signals allowing monitored patients to move at will within the facility
- Complete wireless coverage for the network across all areas of the property, with guest wireless access available for patients and, families
- Secure remote communication to the facility so care providers who are offsite can access systems and diagnostic information on their patients

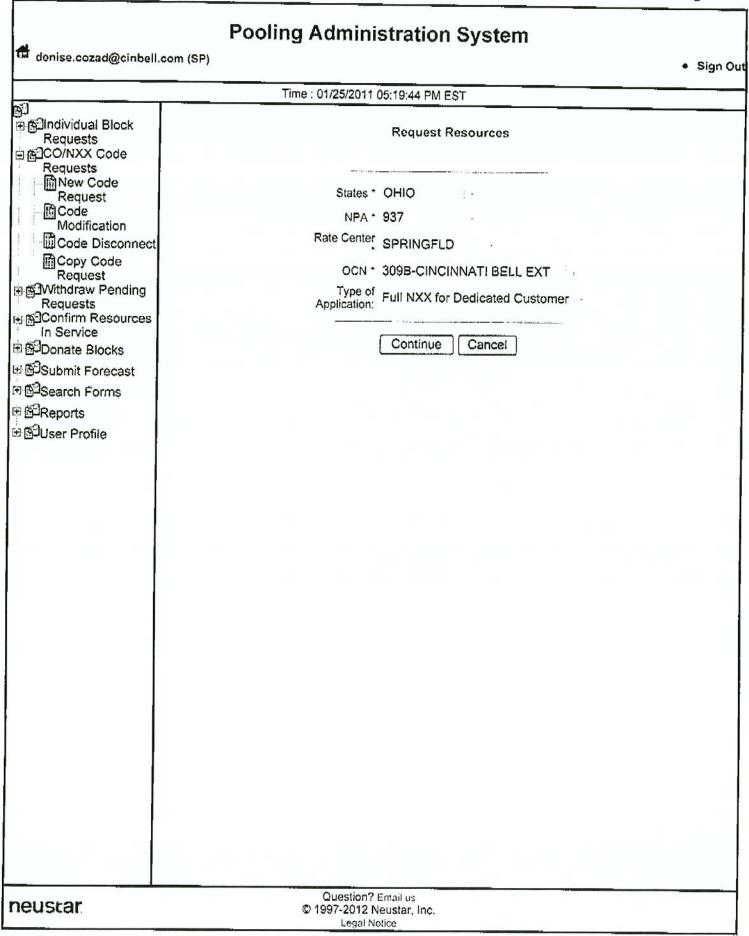

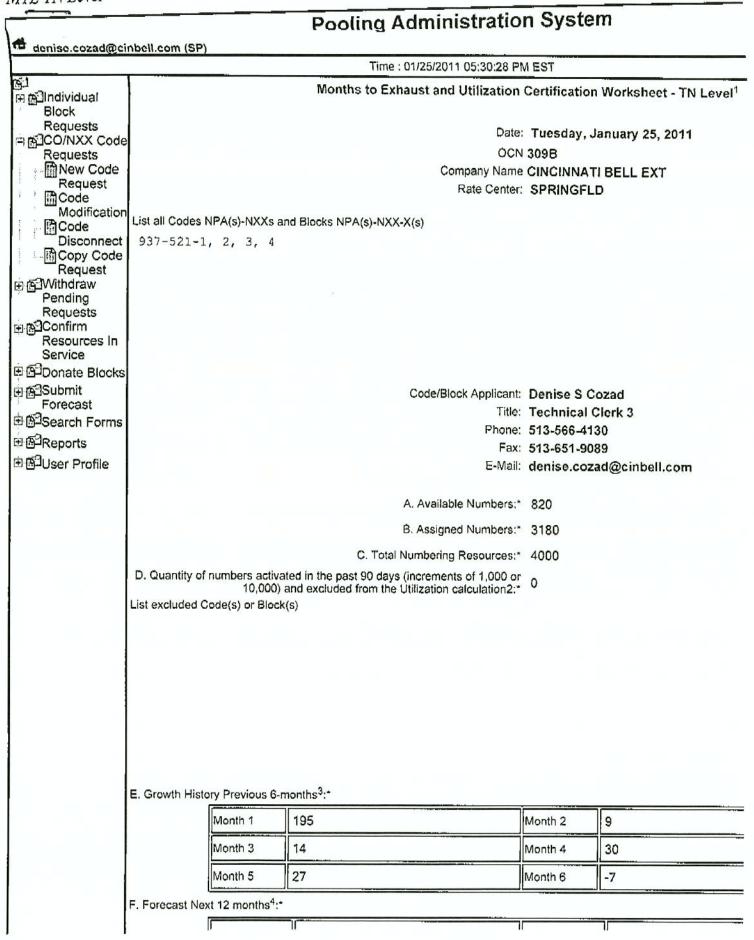
