On February 28, 2011, CenturyLink filed tariff revisions with the Federal Communications Commission to replace CenturyTel Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 with CenturyLink Operating Companies (CLOC) Tariff F.C.C. No. 1. The rates, regulations and charges contained in CLOC Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 are identical to those found in the CenturyTel Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 with the exception of minor textual changes necessary to reflect the revised page numbers and ensure consistent section headings and references.

This filing proposes to change references of CenturyTel Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 to CenturyLink Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, where appropriate, within the body of the tariff. The addition of d/b/a CenturyLink is added to the header of affected pages included with this filing and is being made without margin symbolization. In addition, the tariff page footers have been revised for consistency without margin symbolization to reflect Duane Ring as the officer contact name.

If the IXC does not furnish the data, the IXC shall identify all Switched Access Services that could carry such calls in order for the Telephone Company to accumulate the minutes of use through the use of special Telephone Company measuring and recording equipment.

5.2 Local Exchange Access and Enhanced Services Exemption

When access to the local exchange is required to provide an IXC service (e.g., MTS/WATS-type, telex, Data, etc.) that uses a resold Special Access service, Switched Access Service Rates and Regulations, as set forth in Section 6. of CenturyLink Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 will apply, except when such access to the local exchange is required for the provision of an enhanced service.

Resold Services

6.1 Scope

Where the IXC is reselling MTS and/or MTS-type service(s) on which the Carrier Common Line and Switched Access charges have been assessed, the IXC may, at the option of the IXC, obtain Feature Group A, Feature Group B or Feature Group D Switched Access Service under Section 6 of CenturyLink Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 for originating and/or terminating access in the local exchange. Such access group arrangements whether single lines or trunks or multiline hunt groups or trunk groups will have Carrier Common Line Access charges applied as set forth in the Telephone Company's Intrastate Access Service Tariff in accordance with the resale rate regulations set forth in 6.4 following. For purposes of administering this provision:

Resold intrastate terminating MTS and MTS-type service(s) shall include collect calls, third number calls and credit card calls where the reseller pays the underlying carrier's service charges.

Resold intrastate originating MTS and MTS-type service(s) shall not include collect, third number, or credit card calls.

7.3 Unmeasured Feature Group A and B Usage

When Carrier Common Line Access is provided in association with Feature Group A or Feature Group B Switched Access Service in Telephone Company offices that are not equipped for measurement capabilities, assumed average intrastate access minutes will be used to determine Carrier Common Line Access charges. These assumed access minutes are as set forth in the exchange carriers' access tariffs.

7.4 Percent Intrastate Use (PIU)

When the IXC reports interstate and intrastate use of in-service Switched Access Service, Carrier Common Line charges will be billed to intrastate Switched Access Service access minutes based on the data reported by the IXC as set forth in Section 2.3.11 of CenturyLink Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 (Jurisdictional Reports), except where the Telephone Company is billing according to actuals by jurisdiction. Intrastate Switched Access Service access minutes will, when necessary, be used to determine Carrier Common Line Charges as set forth in 7.5 following.

7.5 Determination of Premium Charges

After the adjustments as set forth in 7.4 preceding have been applied, when necessary, to Switched Access Service access minutes, charges for the involved IXC account will be determined as follows:

- A. Access minutes for all premium rated Switched Access Service subject to Carrier Common Line charges will be multiplied by the Premium Access per minute rate as set forth in the Telephone Company's Intrastate Access Service Tariff.
- B. Access minutes for all FGB Access Services with an Abbreviated Dialing Arrangement (ADA) subject to Carrier Common Line Charges will be multiplied by the Premium Access per minute rate as set forth in the Telephone Company's Intrastate Access Service Tariff.
- C. Carrier Common Line charges shall not be reduced as set forth in 6.1 preceding unless Switched Access Charges, as set forth in Section 6 of CenturyLink Operating Companies Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, are applied to the IXC's Switched Access Services. (T)
