FINDING AND ORDER

The Commission finds:

- (1) On May 13, 2008, a vehicle operated and driven by Calvin Farris (Respondent) was inspected within the State of Ohio. The inspection resulted in the discovery of four apparent violations: (1) defective brakes in violation of 49 C.F.R. § 393.45; (2) brakes out of adjustment in violation of 49 C.F.R. § 393.47(e); (3) brakes out of adjustment in violation of 49 C.F.R. § 393.47(e); and (4) inoperable low air warning device in violation of 49 C.F.R. § 393.51.
- (2) Staff timely served Respondent with a notice of preliminary determination, in accordance with Rule 4901:2-7-12, Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.), that assessed a civil forfeiture of \$350.00 for the alleged violations.
- (3) On April 15, 2009, Respondent made a formal request for an administrative hearing pursuant to Rule 4901:2-7-13, O.A.C.
- (4) On February 24, 2011, the parties filed a settlement agreement. The settlement agreement consists of the following provisions:
  - (a) The Staff and the Respondent agree that the Respondent will pay a civil forfeiture in the amount of \$175.00 in this case. The reduction is based on information provided by the Respondent and the compounding of the proposed forfeiture due to two violations involving the same brake chamber.

- (b) Within 30 days of the effective date of this settlement agreement, the Respondent shall make payment of the civil forfeiture using a certified check or money order payable to "Treasurer State of Ohio" and mailed to PUCO Fiscal, 180 E. Broad St., 4th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793. The inspection number (OH3283005564C) should be written on each certified check or money order.
  - (c) This settlement agreement shall not become effective until adopted by the Commission. The date of the entry or order of the Commission adopting the settlement agreement shall be considered the effective date of the settlement agreement.
  - (d) This settlement agreement is made in settlement of all factual or legal issues in this case. It is not intended to have any effect whatsoever in any other case or proceeding.
- (5) The Commission finds that the settlement agreement is reasonable and should be approved and adopted.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the settlement agreement be approved and adopted. It is, further,

ORDERED, That Respondent is ordered to pay the state of Ohio as set forth in finding 4. It is, further,

ORDERED, That if payment is not received in accordance with the settlement agreement, the Attorney General of Ohio take the appropriate action to enforce this order as provided by law. It is, further,

ORDERED, That this case be closed. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Finding and Order be served upon all parties of record.


