

We have audited the accompanying comparative balance sheets of The Dayton Power and Light Company (the "Company") as of December 31, 2010 and 2009, and the related statements of income, retained earnings, cash flows and accumulated comprehensive income, comprehensive income and hedging activities for the years then ended included on pages 110 through 123 (excluding page 116) of the accompanying Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Report Form No 1. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Company's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audits.

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.
