# **NOTICE OF INFORMATION SUBMITTAL**

Black Fork Wind Energy, LLC ("Black Fork" or "the Applicant") hereby gives notice that it has submitted to the Staff of the Ohio Power Siting Board information regarding the location of proposed meteorological towers and population estimates through 2021. The Applicant initially sought waivers from Rules 4906-17-05(B)(2)(i) and 4906-17-08(A)(1) regarding this information. After discussion with the Staff and agreement between the parties, the Applicant submitted a response brief on April 21, 2011 committing to provide the location of the meteorological towers and the 2021 population estimate information prior to the end of the completeness review period. To that end, the Applicant has submitted to the Staff a project layout map showing the location of three proposed permanent meteorological towers and population estimates for counties, townships, cities and villages through 2021. A copy of the Applicant's correspondence to the Staff along with a copy of the layout map and population information is attached hereto.

Accordingly, with the submittal of the information and as stated in the Applicant's April 21, 2011 response brief, the Applicant withdraws its request for wavier from



# **Supplemental Population Information 4906-17-08 Social and Ecological Data**

# (A) Health and Safety

# (1) Demographic

The Generation Facility is located in Auburn, Jackson, Jefferson, Sandusky, and Vernon townships of Crawford County, Ohio and Plymouth and Sharon townships in Richland County. Additional jurisdictions located within a 5-mile radius of the proposed Project include the townships of villages of Plymouth, Shiloh, New Washington, Tiro, Ontario, and North Robinson and the cities of Crestline, Shelby, Mansfield, and Galion. Table 1 provides the U.S. Census population for 2010, and estimates for 2011, 2020, and 2021 for each county, township, city, and village that occurs within 5 miles of the proposed Project.

Population information for 2011 and projections for 2021 are not currently available, therefore to estimate 2011 and 2021 populations for the communities within a 5-mile radius, the annual growth rate, extrapolated from 2020 QDOD projected county populations was used. Because population projections, and therefore growth rates, are only available at the County level, township, village, and city populations were estimated for these governmental units by utilizing the estimated population change for their respective county (i.e., Crawford County was estimated to experience an increase in population from 2010 to 2020 of approximately 1.1%, which was applied to Auburn Township [795 \* (1+0.011) = 804]). The 10-year estimated population rates of change are 1.1%, for Crawford County, 6.4% for Huron County, 4.5% for Richland County and (-)4.4% for Seneca County.
