ENTRY

The Commission finds:

- (1) On June 12, 2009, AT&T Ohio (AT&T Ohio) filed its basic local exchange service (BLES) application pursuant to Section 4927.03, Revised Code and Rule 4901:1-4-09, Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.). Pursuant to its application, AT&T Ohio seeks approval of an alternative form of BLES and other Tier 1 services in the following 16 exchanges: Aberdeen, Arabia, Bowersville, Clarington, Corning, Duffy, Gnadenhutten, Murray City, New Holland, New Matamoras, Newport, Sedalia, Somerton, Sugar Grove, Sugar Tree Ridge, and Woodfield. In support of its application, AT&T Ohio proposes a company-specific alternative competitive market test in accordance with Rule 4901:1-4-10(C), O.A.C.
- (2) On February 28, 2011, AT&T Ohio filed a request that this application be dismissed due to the fact that on September 13, 2010, an application was filed in Case No. 10-1412-TP-BLS (10-1412), *In the Matter of the Application of The Ohio Bell Telephone Company d/b/a AT&T Ohio for a Commission Determination Pursuant to Section 4927.12(C)(3), Revised Code*, which included the same 16 exchanges that were included in this proceeding. In support of its request, AT&T Ohio notes that the application in 10-1412 has been successfully concluded.
- (3) AT&T Ohio's request that its application be dismissed is reasonable and should be granted.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That AT&T Ohio's request to dismiss its application be granted in accordance with Finding (3). It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.


