## **ENTRY**

## The Commission finds:

- (1) On April 29, 2011, Nationwide Biweekly Administration, Inc. (Nationwide or complainant), filed a complaint against Velocity The Greatest Phone Company Ever, Inc. (Velocity) alleging, inter alia, that Velocity has engaged in an unfair or deceptive act or practice by not providing a clear and not misleading explanation of the increased charges on Nationwide's bill. Additionally, Nationwide asserted that Velocity had threatened to disconnect service to it if certain invoices were not paid.
- (2) On May 17, 2011, Nationwide filed a document stating that the case could be dismissed with prejudice as the parties had reached a settlement of the matters involved in the complaint.
- (3) Based on complainants' assertion that this matter has been settled, the Commission will dismiss this case of record with prejudice.
