

PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME ON BEHALF OF THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF OHIO FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME IN WHICH TO FILE ITS APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF ITS TELECOMMUNICATIONS RELAY SERVICE CERTIFICATION

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO or Ohio Commission) is the designate agency within the state of Ohio with oversight responsibility concerning the provision of intrastate telecommunications relay service (TRS). In this petition, the PUCO requests an extension of time until November 17, 1997, to provide the FCC with a high-quality application for renewal of TRS certification. Support for the Ohio Commission's request for an extension of time follows.

On June 24, 1997, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) released a Public Notice (DA 97-1321) indicating that it would accept applications for renewal of state telecommunications relay service program certifications until October 1, 1997. Current state certifications expire July 26, 1998. The FCC's rules provide that states may apply for renewal of their certified state TRS program one year prior to

expiration of certification. 47 C.F.R. Part 64.605(c). Certifications are valid for a five-year period from July 26, 1998 to July 25, 2003.

On July 10, 1997, the PUCO issued a Finding and Order in Case No. 96-1139-TP-COI (In the Matter of the Commission's Investigation Into Continuation of the Ohio Telecommunications Relay Service). In its Finding and Order, the PUCO tentatively chose, for a five-year period commencing January 1, 1998, the Sprint Communications Company, L.P. (Sprint) as Ohio's intrastate TRS provider, The Ohio Commission, however, has yet to issue its final decision in its 96-1139 investigation formally awarding to Sprint the state of Ohio's intrastate contract since it is still working through the specific details of the TRS contract with Sprint. Ameritech is the current provider of intrastate TRS in Ohio for the time period through December 31, 1997.

Consequently, while being able to assure the FCC that any intrastate provider ultimately selected by the PUCO will meet or exceed the FCC's 47 C.F.R. Part 64.604 TRS rules, the PUCO is currently unable to provide the FCC with the level of detail necessary to ensure a high-quality application for renewal of state certification. Specifically, since the PUCO has not formally selected a TRS provider for the ensuing contract period, it is unable to provide the FCC with specifics concerning the provider. These include, for example, the name of the TRS provider, location of the provider, special services provided to users, etc.

The PUCO intends to issue a decision formally selecting an intrastate TRS provider by October 30, 1997. The PUCO further anticipates that it will need only an additional 10 business days after formally selecting a vendor to compile a high-quality application for renewal of state TRS certification. Consequently, the PUCO is requesting an extension until November 17, 1997 to a provide the FCC with its application for renewal.

The PUCO wishes to thank the FCC for timely considering this petition for an extension of time to file for renewal of state TRS certification.
