To the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio:

On July 28, 2010, Ohio Edison Company ("Ohio Edison") and Lowe's Home Centers, Inc. (the "Customer") filed an Application in this docket to commit the energy efficiency savings realized by the Customer's energy efficiency project(s) for integration with Ohio Edison's energy efficiency program to meet Ohio Edison's statutorily imposed energy efficiency and peak demand reduction requirements. In exchange for the commitment of its energy savings to Ohio Edison, the Customer sought an exemption from Ohio Edison's energy efficiency cost recovery rider. The Application is currently pending before the Commission.

The Customer subsequently determined that it preferred a cash rebate payment instead of a rider exemption. Accordingly, the Customer now seeks a cash rebate payment of \$500,000 instead of a rider exemption.<sup>1</sup> A document demonstrating how this cash rebate payment was calculated is attached to this letter. There are no substantive differences between the original Application and the amended Application other than the request for a cash rebate instead of a rider exemption. Accordingly, Ohio Edison requests that the Commission approve the Application and permit the Customer to receive the requested cash rebate payment.

#### Notes

- (1) Customer's usage is adjusted to account for the effects of the energy efficiency programs included in this application. When applicable, such adjustments are prorated to the in-service date to account for partial year savings.
- (2) The eligible rebate amount is based upon 75% of the rebates offered by the FirstEnergy Commercial and Industrial Energy Efficiency programs or 75% of \$0.80/KWh for customer programs for all energy savings eligible for a cash rebate as defined in the PUCO order in Case No. 10-834-EL-EEC dated 9/15/2010, not to exceed the lesser of 50% of the project cost or \$250,000 per project. The rebate also cannot exceed \$500,000 per customer per year, per utility service territory.
- (3) Total projects/site cash rebate amount exceeds the \$500,000 maximum per customer per year, per operating company, therefore, the total cash rebate allowed will be \$500,000 for the Ohio Edison Operating Company
