As background, this complaint by the UTU was filed with PUCO on September 22, 2011 and mailed to Mr. Rusty Orben, CSXT, in Columbus, Ohio on September 23, 2011. In the complaint submitted by Luther G. (Glenn) Newsom, on behalf of the UTU, he alleges an unsafe condition due to excessive growth of weeds and vegetation in the vicinity of Ridgeway, Hardin/Logan Counties, Ohio, at Scottslawn Secondary. Specifically, at Hayes Siding, north from Hale Drive MP QT 81.54 to south MP CP 82.

Upon learning of the Complaint on or about October 12, 2011, an investigation into the allegations was undertaken by contacting the Roadmaster of the area of concern, Ron Hartzell. Mr. Hartzell advised this area has been sprayed for vegetation control and that Jerry Gibson with the PUCO inspected the area of concern on Monday, October 17th. Mr. Gibson confirmed with Mr. Hartzell there was no exception taken at this location.
