

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MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER

I. BACKGROUND

Reflective Energy Solutions, LLC ("RES") seeks an order protecting the confidentiality of the information contained in Exhibits C-3 and C-5 filed with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (the "Commission") in connection with RES's Renewal Certification Application, Competitive Retail Natural Gas Suppliers (as Aggregator and Broker) (the "Gas Renewal Application").

On or about November 4, 2011, RES filed its Gas Renewal Application with the Commission, with Exhibits C-3 and C-5 thereto in redacted form. On or about November 15, 2011, RES was informed that its Gas Renewal Application was deficient for failing to include content in Exhibits C-3 and C-5.

RES is contemporaneously filing un-redacted copies of Exhibits C-3 and C-5 to its Gas Renewal Application under seal pursuant to this Motion, with each page marked as "Confidential". Exhibit C-3 contains RES's officer certified financial statements, and Exhibit C-5 contains RES's forecasted financial statements.

II. LAW AND ARGUMENT

Under Ohio Administrative Code Section 4901-1-24(D):

Upon motion of any party or person with regard to the filing of a document with the commission's docketing division relative to a case before the commission, the commission, the legal director, the deputy legal director, or an attorney examiner **may issue any order which is necessary to protect the confidentiality of information contained in the document**, to the extent that state or federal law prohibits release of the information, including where the information is deemed by the commission, the legal director, the deputy legal director, or the attorney examiner to constitute a trade secret under Ohio law, and where

nondisclosure of the information is not inconsistent with the purposes of Title 49 of the Revised Code.

(Emphasis added). RES seeks to protect the confidentiality of the information contained in Exhibits C-3 and C-5 filed with the Commission in connection with its Gas Renewal Application.

Ohio Revised Code Section 4929.20(A) provides:

No...retail natural gas supplier shall provide a competitive retail natural gas service on or after thirteen months following the effective date of this section to a consumer in this state without first being certified by the public utilities commission regarding **its managerial, technical, and financial capability to provide that service and providing reasonable financial assurances** sufficient to protect customers and natural gas companies from default.

(Emphasis added). In keeping with this mandate, the Commission requires an applicant who wishes to serve as a retail natural gas aggregator and broker to provide the Commission with, among other things, the applicant's two (2) most recent years of audited or officer-certified financial statements (attached to the Gas Renewal Application as Exhibit C-3) and two (2) years of forecasted financial statements for the applicant (attached to the Gas Renewal Application as Exhibit C-5).

The detailed financial information requested by the Commission is highly proprietary information and constitutes a trade secret under Ohio law. Under Ohio Revised Code Section 1333.61(D):

"Trade Secret" means information, including the whole or any portion or phase of...any business information or plans, financial information...that satisfies both of the following:

(1) It derives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use.


(2) It is the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy.

RES is a privately held limited liability company whose financial information is not publicly available and is not generally known. If this sensitive information is disclosed to the public, RES's competitors will unjustly benefit therefrom. Accordingly, the information contained in Exhibits C-3 and C-5 to RES's Gas Renewal Application clearly falls within the scope of the Ohio Revised Code's definition of a "trade secret." Under these circumstances, the Commission has the authority to issue a protective order to prevent the public disclosure of RES's confidential and trade secret information. See O.A.C. 4901-1-24(D).

WHEREFORE, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code Section 4901-1-24(D), Reflective Energy Solutions, LLC respectfully requests that the Commission grant its Motion and issue a Protective Order to maintain the information contained in Exhibits C-3 and C-5 of RES's Gas Renewal Application under seal and confidential.
