

PLAN OF OPERATION AND **GOVERNANCE FOR ELECTRIC AGGREGATION**

ADOPTED BY LAKE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES Date: December 29, 2003

OVERVIEW

At the November 4, 2003 general election, local residents authorized the Lake Township Board of Trustees ("House") to create an opt-out Electric Aggregation Program ("Aggregation Program") for the unincorposated areas of Lake Township, Wood County, Ohio ("Township") in compliance with Section 4928.20 of the Ohio Revised Code. Under the opt-out Electric Aggregation Program, all eligible electric consumers within the unincorposated areas of the Township will be entouninally included in the Aggregation Program initially. However, all consumers will also be given the opportunity to ope-out or decline participation in the Aggregation Program as set out below in more detail.

The Township's purpose in creeting the Aggregation Program is to represent local contents intenses in emerging competitive electric markets by aggregating electric locals within the uniccorporated error of the Township (including township facilities) and asymptoting more affectable electric supplies and other releast survices on behalf of local community. The Township tany purpose individually or in cooperation with other governmental entities.

Many usual communical and residential electric consumers lack the loverage to effectively negotiate electric supply state and services. A governmental aggregation program provides them with an option for professional approximation and the bargaining power of a larger, more diverse consumer group that may be more amantive to suppliers, allowing them to effectively participate in the competitive process and achieve branches.

1. Description of Services

The Tevanship will not buy and result decededly, but will represent collective consumer interests to set terms and conditions for service. Through a competitive selection process, the Township will develop and negatists a contract with a Retail Electric Generation Provider ("Provider") or Providers. The contract will contain mutually agreeably price terms for electric supplies and other related services. The Township may pursue this purpose individually or in cooperation with other governmental emission. It is commapheed that the Township may jobs with five Northwest Chie Aggregation Conlition (NOAC) who uses a professional energy consultant to develop and administer its program. In order to identify the electrical supplies, the Township may bid, seek requests for proposal, or take other competitive measures sained to current market conditions. The Township may also muck to be acked to entain gard proposed NOAC comments. The Township also reserves the right to eather hoto manuscis on its own or with other governmental cutties other than NOAC. Once the contents has been finalized, it will be automitted to the Lake Township Board of Trustees for apparent.

The Aggregation Program covers only the compatitive schall electric services (electric generation service, aggregation service, power marketing, and power brokering) of a participant's electric bill. Toledo lidica, a First Energy Company ("TE") will continue to deliver electricity to Aggregation Program participants' homes and businesses through its checkin distribution system as a monopoly function regulated by the Public Utilities Contemicate of Ohio ("POCO"). TE will also continue to latell, operate and nationals its system of transmission lines, rights of way, resten and other

electric distribution components. Aggregation Program participants should continue to call TE if their electric service is interrupted or if they have billing questions. The PUCO will continue to oversee TE electric suflety and administrative environ standards.

Oversight and development of the Aggregation Program will be the responsibility of the Administrative Service Director with the advice of the Township Solicitor. The Administrative Service Director shall report to the Township Beard of Trustees, keep the Board of Trustees fally advised, and related for its approval all contracts and along for approval.

Due to the complexity of the electic utility industry and the associations of its associated matrestaring safetisian, it is contemplated that the Township may join NOAC who uses a professional energy consultant. The Township may seach an agreement with NOAC, in consultant, or with other governmental entitles or consultant to provide the accountry expertise to represent the Township's inparent in legislative and regulatory matters and/or to serve as the Aggregation Program Manager. Such services may include, but are not limited to, facilitating consumer conclinates and opt-out, assisting with consumer education, addressing consumer questions and concerns, providing reports on program operation, sarediness and sevings, negotiating fature Provider continues, and representing the Township in dealings with Providers, TE, the Ohio Legislature, the PUCO and the Ohio Consumer's Coursel ("OCC").

The Provider will provide a local or toll five salephone pumber for participant questions and nonzerou about empliment, ope-out provisions, billing and other Aggregation Program issues.

The Provider will develop internal controls and processes to help ensure that the Township remains in good standing as a governmental aggregator that complies with all laws, rules and regulations regarding the same as they may be periodically an anticed.

All Aggregation Program participants shall enjoy the pertentions of law affinded to comment as they currently exist or as they may be amended from time to time. These include rights to quantum billings or curvice quality or service practices. All program participants shall also only the individual right to decline participation in the Aggregation Program subject to the terms and conditions contained berein.

All Aggregation Program participants will be treated equivally. They will be gomesteed the sight to raise and resolve disputes with the Provider, he provided all required notices and information; and always retain the right to opt-out of the Aggregation Program or switch supplies subject to the terms and conditions contained hereis.

All consumers within the Township's unincorporated error simil be cligible to participate in the Aggregation Program subject to the terms and conditions described baseln, Obio 1600, EUCO roles and regulations governing electrical service, and TE approved satisfic.

Service made: the Aggregation Program shall include all slightle contours classes in ashermonwith universal service principles and requirements, and the traditional non-discriminatory previous of local government. The Tewaship will seek to include in Provider contrasts provisions an maintain these principles and equitable treatment of all customer classes. Low-income consumer shall remain subject to all provisions of Ohjo law and PUCO rules and requisions so they may be expended from time to time regarding their rights to return to TE Owners! Service and participation in the Aggregation Program.

The Township developed this Plan of Operation and Governmen in compilance with Ohio law regarding ept-out aggregation of electric consumers, including two public hearings galor to its adoption.

The Lake Township Board of Trassess shall approve through resolution the Aggregation Program's Plan of Operation and Governments in accordance with Otto Revised Code Section 4928.20. Assessments to the Plan of Operation and Government that he subject to Lake Township Board of Trasses approval and filling with the PUCO.

After adoption of the Plan of Operation and Government, the Township will file with the FUCO for pursuamental appropriate cartification and also register as a governmental appropriate with Th.

Aggregation Program participants are subject to the same standards and responsibilities as other electric communics, including payment of billings and access to mesoring and other equipment assessed to carry out utility operations.

The Aggregation Progress may be discontinued upon the newsignation or expiration of the Provider contract without my returnies, renown or subsequent contract being unbeauty. In the event of Aggregation Progress tecnsionation, such participant will secrete notification at least staty (60) days prior to such progress templation and could return to TE General Service Rate.

2. Drieselinden of Princ

The Township will not buy and result clustricity to Aggregation Program participants. The Township will aggregate electric loads within the Township's unincorporated arose including township helities. Through a competitive adjection present, the Township will develop and negotiate a contract with a satuil electric generation Provider or Providers. The contract with contain summally agreeable price terms for electric supplies and other related services. The Township entry passes this purpose individually or in cooperation with other government satisfies. It is consumplant that the Township may join with the Northwest Ohio Aggregation Confident (NOAC) who was a professional country exactions to develop and administer its program. The Township may such to be added to existing and proposed NOAC contracts for electric and related services, but also reserves the right to sater into contacts on its own or with other governmental activities. Once the contracts has been finalized, it will be substitted to the Luke Township Bourd of Trustees for approval. Contracts will be manifered by the Township on behalf of consuments.

The Provider will supply information on electric supply charges by TE customer sets electrication or other appropriate pricing entergery at approved by the Township. All closeric supply charges will be fully and prominently disclosed in consumer carolinant materials and will be subject to approved by the Lake Township Board of Trustees.

The Township will contract only with a Provider or Providers that most at a minimum the following otheris:

- First sufficient sources of power to provide retail first power to the maidure and businesses of the indicateparated areas of Lake Township.
- > Is a Houseof Federal Power Manhouse with the Pederal Emergy Regulatory Commission.
- > is contified as a CRES by the FUCO.
- Has a Survice Agreement for Natwork Integration Transmission Service under First Energy's Open Access Transmission Tariff.
- Its Electronic Data Inscrebenge occupater network is fully functional and capable of handling the TB retail electric contensors in the unimporposated seems of Luke Township.
- First a tell-first member an required by the PUCO for customer regretor and complaints coloited to Lake Township's Simple Aggregation Progrets.
- Will hold Lake Township floancintly hamiless from any financial obliquitous arising from supplying power to the FBS retail electric customers in the unincorporated eross of Lake Township.
- > Demonstrates sufficient could worthings.

The Provider's content will run for a fixed term (i.e., one to five years) and contain all privings thereas, switching fees, one in clear and understandable terms.

It is the Township's goal that The Provider's rates will include an administrative See, which shall (if implemented) be collected on behalf of the Township to find the implementation and administration of the Township's Appropriate Program. The administrative for will be adjusted transmity to cover the Township's cost of administrating the program.

TE maigne contours rate observices, character of envise and especiated regulated rates subject to PUCO approved tariffs. In addition to the Provider's electric service charges, consumer will continue to be billed for TE service and delivery charges.

3. Plan for Providing Out-out Notice

leitially, each eligible consumer within the Township's unincorporated stem will be automatically included in the Aggregation Program. However, prior to actual encounter well receive a notice from the Township detailing the Aggregation Program's rates, same and conditions.

Each commerce will then have a 21-day period to opt-out of or decline to perticipate in the Aggregation Program without charge. Commence opting out of the program will remain on Toledo Edland, a First Energy Commence (EE) established teriff rates. A similar opt-out period will be offered every two years during which time commences can leave the Aggregation Program without paying a switching fee.

4. Process for Determining the Past of Customers

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After contract approval by the Lake Township Board of Trustees, the Provider will work with the Township and TE to identify all sligible consumes within the Township's unincomposated areas.

All eligible commuters will be notified of the rates, charges and other terms and opaditions of participation in the Aggregation Program and that they will be determinedly smelled in the Aggregation Program unless they "opt-out" or desline participation in the program. Communes will be given a 21-day period in which to notify the Township that they wish to opt-out or desline participation in the Aggregation Program.

After the initial 21-day ope-out period has elapsed, all eligible communers who have not notified the Township of their dusire to opt out of the Aggregation Program will be emplied by the Provider at the curious date practicable.

Consumes somiled in the Aggregation Program by the Provider will consive a letter from TE extifying these of their durchment. Consumers will have a recisation period of seven (7) valendar days to notify TE of any objection to their corollment in the Aggregation Program. TE will notify the Provider of countries objections or any recons that a communer was not carolled in the Aggregation Program.

Customers who most the inflowing extends will become Members of the Aggregation Program:

- Are up to date with their bill payments;
- > Have not opted out of the program;
- > Currently have service with TE:

The Provider will trailed and atsignain a database of all Aggregation Program participants. The database will include the same, address and TS account marries and nety include other participant information as agreed upon by the Township and the Provider. Such information may include the Provider's excesse transfer (if different from TS account mamber), rate code, sider code (if applicable), most recent 12 mostim of electric consumption, and motor reading cycle. The Aggregation Program database will be updated at loss quarterly. The Township will have the right to access information in the database for purposes of multing.

The Provider will report to the Township the states of the Aggregation Program enrollment on at least a mentally basis unless otherwise agreed.

In addition to the initial 21-day ope-out period described above, such participant will be gives an opportunity to ope-out of the Aggregation Program every two years without paying a switching fire. Consumers who choose to cut out of the Aggregation Program at any time other than during the initial 21-day ope-out period or during subsequent opt-out pariods offered by the Township may be subject to a projecting for.

5. Continue Billing Procedures

The Township plans to utilize TE consolidated billing service in which each consumer account monitor one bill itemizing the Provider's decide supply charges and TE delivery, transition and other PUCO-approved charges. The billing statement will be consistent with applicable PUCO mice and regulations. The Township will consider other billing options, hashing Provider sometimes the plane of the provider of the position of the provider of the provider of the position of the po

7. Governmental Actrometer's Continuer Service Procedures, and Discuss Benchtian

The Aggregation Program only impacts the source of compatitive electric retail supply. TE will continue to deliver the electricity purchased factorish the Aggregation Program to participants' homes and businesses through its electric distribution system. Participants with question of contexts regarding survice delivery or safety, such as a electric outage should continue to context TE. Dear NOAC Community Resident.

We are providing you the opportunity to join other residents to save money on the electricity you use. Savings are possible through governmental aggregation, where community officials bring together citizens to gain group buying power for the purchase of electricity from a retail electric generation provider certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. Voters in the NOAC (Northwest Ohio Aggregation Coalition) communities approved this program in November 2000.

After researching competitive electricity pricing options for you, we have chosen FirstEnergy Solutions Corp., a subsidiary of FirstEnergy Corp., to provide you with savings on your electric generation through May 2014. There is no cost for enrollment and you will not be charged a switching fee. You do not need to do anything to participate.

As a member of this aggregation, you are guaranteed to save 6 percent off your Price to Compare. Your Price to Compare is essentially the price you pay for electric generation from the utility and consists of generation and transmission related components, which are the costs associated with generating the power and delivering it through the transmission system.

To estimate what your savings per kilowatt-hour (KWH) will be through this program, locate your Price to Compare on your electric bill. Divide your Price to Compare by 100, then multiply by 0.06 (6%) to determine your savings per KWH. Multiply that number by your total monthly usage. The final number is how much you can expect to save each month you use the same amount of electricity.

You will see your electric savings from FirstEnergy Solutions after your enrollment has been completed and your switch has been finalized – approximately 30 - 45 days, depending upon your meter read date. Of course, you are not obligated to participate in the NOAC electric governmental aggregation program. If you wish to be excluded from the program and remain a full-service customer of your local electric utility – Toledo Edison – you have until December 19, 2011 to return the attached "opt-out" form. If you do not opt out at this time, you will receive a notice at least every three years asking if you wish to remain in the program. If you leave the program at any other time, you could be subject to a \$25 cancellation fee from FirstEnergy Solutions – and you might not be served under the same rates, terms and conditions that apply to other customers served by Toledo Edison.

After you become a participant in this governmental aggregation program, Toledo Edison will send you a letter confirming your selection of FirstEnergy Solutions as your electric generation provider. As required by law, this letter will inform you of your option to cancel your contract with FirstEnergy Solutions within seven days of its postmark. To remain in the NOAC electric governmental aggregation program, you don't need to take any action when this letter arrives.

Toledo Edison will continue to maintain the system that delivers power to your home – no new poles or wires will be built by FirstEnergy Solutions. You will continue to receive a single, easy-to-read bill from your local electric utility with your FirstEnergy Solutions charges included. The only thing you'll notice is savings.

NOAC Electric Governmental Aggregation Program Frequently Asked Questions

What is aggregation?

Under governmental aggregation, local officials bring citizens together to gain group buying power for the purchase of competitively priced electricity from a retail electric generation supplier certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.

How is my community able to choose a certified electric generation supplier on my behalf?

In November 2000, NOAC (Northwest Ohio Aggregation Coalition) residents voted to allow the community to contract for an electric generation supplier on their behalf.

How will I know if I can save money under the NOAC electric governmental aggregation program?

Under this governmental aggregation program, the price you pay for electric generation supply is guaranteed to be 6 percent lower. In other words, each month, you'll pay 6 percent less for the generation portion of your electric supply than if you had not joined the NOAC governmental aggregation program.

What do I need to do if I want to be included in this government aggregation?

You do not need to do anything to receive the discounted generation pricing under this program. You may choose to remain in the aggregation group and begin receiving your 6-percent discount by simply not returning the opt out form.

If I join the NOAC electric aggregation program, who will deliver my power, read my meter and respond to emergencies, such as power outages?

Your local electric company will be responsible for the delivery of power to your home or business. Since your local electric utility still owns the wires and poles that deliver power to you, it will continue to read your meter and restore power after an outage.

Is your price for residential power fixed, or does it vary?

In this program, the discount you will receive is fixed, so each month you will save 6 percent off the generation portion of your bill. Since the actual price per KWH charged by the utility may change each month based on the season and your usage, the price per KWH from FirstEnergy Solutions will also change each month. Regardless, you are guaranteed to save 6 percent off the competitive portion of your electric bill.

What does "opt out" mean?

"Opt out" means that you can decide not to participate in the NOAC electric governmental aggregation program. By returning the opt-out form, which is included in this mailing, by the due date you will not be enrolled as an electric generation customer with FirstEnergy Solutions, the community's competitive electric generation supplier, and you will not receive the 6-percent discount.

What happens if I do not send in the opt-out form?

If you do not return the opt-out form postmarked by the due date, you will be included in the NOAC governmental aggregation program and will begin receiving competitively priced electricity from FirstEnergy Solutions.

Can I opt out over the phone?

No, if you want to opt out, you must mail in your completed opt-out form and it must be postmarked by the due date.

Can I opt out of the program at a later date?

Yes, but you will be subject to a \$25 cancellation fee from FirstEnergy Solutions if you cancel for any other reason but moving. However, you will be sent a notice at least every three years asking if you wish to remain in the program. At that point, you may opt out at no cost.

What are my energy supply choices if I decide to opt out?

You can stay with your current electric utility, which will continue to supply your electricity as it always has, or you can shop for an alternative generation supplier. A list of competitive electric suppliers certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio and trieir current prices is available by calling 1-800-686-PUCO (1-800-686-7826).

If I join the aggregation, can I stay on budget billing?

Yes, you can remain on budget billing; however, the budget billing program does not apply to your charges from FirstEnergy Solutions – only to charges from the electric utility. Your total charges from FirstEnergy Solutions will fluctuate from month to month according to your usage.

Can I still have my payment automatically deducted from my checking account as I do now? Yes. How you pay your electric bill will not change.

These Terms and Conditions together with the enrollment information are your agreement for electric generation service with FirstEnergy Solutions Corp. ("FES") if you choose to remain in the community aggregation program by not "opting-out" or exercising the right of rescission ("Contract"). Please keep a copy of this agreement for your records.

FES is certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("PUCO") to offer and supply electric generation services in Ohio. As a Competitive Retail Electric Service ("CRES") provider, FES will supply the electric generation to your Electric Distribution Utility ("EDU") based on your usage. Your EDU then distributes or delivers the electricity to you. FES sets the generation prices and charges that the customers pay. The PUCO regulates distribution prices and services. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission regulates transmission prices and services.

DEFINITIONS:

Generation Service - The production of electricity.

Transmission Service – Moving high voltage electricity from a generation facility to the distribution lines of an EDU.

Distribution Service - Physical delivery of electricity to customers by EDU.

RIGHT OF RESCISSION – If you do not opt-out and are enrolled to receive generation service from FES, your EDU will send you a confirmation letter. You will have the right to rescind your enrollment within seven (7) calendar days following the postmark date of the confirmation letter by following the instructions contained in the letter. The Right of Rescission only applies when a customer switches to a generation supplier and not on renewal enrollments. Your EDU will not send a confirmation notice upon any renewal of this Agreement. Should you choose to opt-out of your community's program, you will be served by your EDU's standard service offer established pursuant to section 4928.14 of the Ohio Revised Code unless you choose an alternate & supplier of electricity.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

- Eligibility. Only Residential Customer accounts not enrolled in the Percentage of Income Plan Program (PIPP) and small commercial customers with a peak demand below 399 KW are eligible for this offer from FES. FES reserves the right to refuse enrollment to any customer with an outstanding balance.
- 2. Basic Service Prices. During the term of this Contract, you agree to pay FES for a total combined Transmission, Generation, and Generation Related Charges. You will be billed at the percentage off your EDU Price to Compare per KWh per billing month, as specified in the opt-out notification. Your Price to Compare consists of bypassable transmission, generation and transmission and generation related components, which are charges associated with the costs of purchased power and the cost to deliver the power through the transmission system. These are the charges that you would avoid for that billing period when you switch to FES.

Your price per KWh will vary because it will always be a percent off the Price to Compare, which may change based on any changes made by the EDU in its calcutations. In addition to FES' charges, you will be charged by your EDU for distribution and various other charges. FES reserves the right to unillaterally modify this billing format in the event the EDU is unable or unwilling to provide consolidated billing in this format or changes the calculation of the Price to Compare.

In addition to the Generation Charge described above, FES will charge you for any and all fees, costs, and obligations imposed by a Regional Transmission Organization ("RTO"), such as the Midwest ISO or successor organizations, that are not otherwise reimbursed by the Electric Utility to Supplier, regardless of whether such charges are greater than, less than, or equal to the charges Customer currently pays for these services to the Electric Utility ("Midwest ISO/Transmission and Ancillary Charges"). FES will pass these Midwest ISO/Transmission and Ancillary Charges, which may be variable, through to you and you will receive no discount or percent-off of these Midwest ISO/Transmission and Ancillary Charges.

- 3. Length of Agreement. As a part of your community's program, your service from FES will commence with the next available meter reading and after processing of the enrollment by your EDU, and will continue for the term as specified in the opt-out notification, ending on the meter read for the last month of service. For the period beginning June 2011, the program may be terminated or modified due to unforeseen regulatory action. Should the program be terminated, you will be returned to the standard service offer or its successor.
- 4. Billing. You will continue to receive a single bill from your EDU that will contain both your EDU and FES charges. FES does not offer budget billing. If you do not pay your bill by the due date, FES may cancel this

Agreement after giving you a minimum of fourteen (14) days written notice. Upon cancellation you will be returned to your EDU as a customer. You will remain responsible to pay FES for any electricity used before this Agreement is cancelled, as well as arry late payment charges. Further, your failure to pay EDU charges may result in your electric service being disconnected in accordance with the EDU tariff.

- Penalties, Fees and Exceptions. If you do not pay the full amount owed FES by the due date of the bill, FES may charge a 1.5% per month late payment fee.
- i. Cancellation/Termination Provisions. If this agreement is not rescinded during the rescission period, enrollment will be sent to your EDU. You may terminate this Agreement, without penalty, if you move out of the EDU service territory or into an area where FES will charge a different price. There will be a \$25 charge for residential customers and a \$50.00 charge for commercial customers if you terminate that Agreement for any other reason, except as expressly provided herein. Should you cancel service with FES and return to standard service offer with your EDU, you may not be served under the same rates, terms, and conditions that apply to other EDU customers.
- Customer Consent and Information Release Authorization. By choosing not to opt-out of your community's aggregation program, you understand and agree to the terms and conditions of this Agreement with FES. You authorize FES to obtain information from the EDU that includes, but is not limited to: billing history, payment history, historical and future electricity usage, meter readings, and characteristics of electricity service. FES reserves the sole right to determine if your credit standing is satisfactory before accepting your enrollment request. This Agreement shall be considered executed by FES following acceptance of your enrollment request by FES, the end of the 7 day rescission period and subsequent acceptance of the enrollment by your EDU.
- 8. Contract Expiration. At least every three years, you will be given the opportunity to opt-out of your community's aggregation program at no cost. You are responsible for arranging for your electric supply upon termination of this Contract.
- 9. Dispute Procedures. If your complaint is not resolved after you have called your electric supplier and/or your electric utility, or for general utility information, residential and business customers may contact the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio for assistance at 1-800-686-7826 (toil free) or TTY at 1-800-686-1570 (toil free) from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm weekdays or at www.PUCO.ohio.gov. Customers may also call the Ohio Consumers' Counsel (OCC) at 1-877-742-5622 (toil free) from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm weekdays or at www.pickocc.org.
- Miscetlaneous. You have the right to request from FES, twice within a 12 month period, up to 24 months of payment history, without charge.

FES will not release your Social Security number and/or account number(s) without your written consent

FES' environmental disclosure statement is available for viewing on our website – www.firstenergysolutions.com. You agree that FES will make the required quarterly updates to the statement electronically on our website. We will also provide the information upon request.

FES may assign its rights to another, including any successor, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the PUCO.

FES assumes no responsibility or liability for the following items that are the responsibility of the EDU: operation and maintenance of the EDU's electrical system, any interruption of service, termination of service, or deterioration of the EDU's service. In the event of a power outage, you should contact your local EDU.

Customer is responsible for providing FES with accurate account information. If said information is incorrect, FES reserves the right to reprice the applicable account(s) or terminate the agreement.

FES reserves the right to return any customer to the EDU if the customer's rate code is changed and the account is no longer eligible for this program.

11. Warranty. FES warrants title and the right to all electricity sold hereunder. THE WARRANTIES SET FORTH IN THIS PARAGRAPH ARE EXCLUSIVE AND ARE IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, WHETHER STATUTORY, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR ARISING OUT OF ANY COURSE OF DEALING OR USAGE OF TRADE.
