- A. I'm Peggy A. Laub.
- Q. And, Ms. Laub, could you describe what your -- where are you employed?
  - A. I'm employed by Duke Energy Business Services in Cincinnati, Ohio.
  - Q. And do you have before you what has been now marked as Duke Energy Exhibit 1?
    - A. I do.
- Q. And is that your direct -- supplemental direct testimony in this proceeding?
  - A. It is.
- Q. You also have before you what's been marked as Joint Exhibit 1.
  - A. Yes.

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- Q. And is that the Stipulation and Recommendation that was docketed in this proceeding?
- 17 A. Yes.
- Q. And with respect to Duke Energy

  Exhibit 1, your supplemental direct testimony, do you

  have any additions or corrections?
  - A. I do not.
  - Q. And if I were to ask you the questions contained in that document again today, would your answers be the same?
- 25 A. Yes.

8 MS. WATTS: Ms. Laub is available for 1 2 cross-examination. 3 EXAMINER TAUBER: Thank you. 4 Do any of the parties have any questions 5 for Ms. Laub today? 6 MR. ETTER: No questions. 7 MR. MOONEY: No. 9 EXAMINER TAUBER: Ms. Laub, I just have a 10 brief question. 11 EXAMINATION 12 By Examiner Tauber: 13 14 If you could turn to your direct Q. 15 testimony. 16 Α. Okay. 17 Q. I think it's the fourth page in, it says: "Does the stipulation benefit consumers and the 18 19 public interest?" In that, you state that the 20 representation of different interests in the 21 proceeding have benefited. Could you also provide 2.2 some details about any benefits there may be to the 23 public interest with actual provisions in the 24 stipulation? 25 A. I'm not sure what you mean.

Q. Let me rephrase that. I'm sorry about that. I didn't mean to confuse you.

In the stipulation, what are some of the provisions that would be in the public interest, some of the negotiated provisions?

- A. That we -- as far as, like, the guaranteed savings?
  - O. Correct. Yeah.
- A. Okay. As part of the stipulation, the company guaranteed future savings to the customers of Duke Energy Ohio related to the deployment of the SmartGrid meters and the automated infrastructure.
- Q. And, in your opinion, that would benefit customers and the public interest?
  - A. Yes.

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- Q. Are there any other major provisions that you are aware of that benefit Duke's customers and the public interest?
  - A. That were part of the stipulation --
  - Q. Correct.
  - A. -- or part of the whole --
  - Q. Just the stipulation in general.
- A. I would say that was the major one.
- 24 EXAMINER TAUBER: Thank you.

Yes. 10 On page 6 of that document, paragraph B. Q. 11 I have it. Α. 12 Q. Are those the savings that you were just 13 now referring to? 14 Α. They are. 15 Okay. Would you turn to page 10 of that Q. document, please. 16 17 Α. I have it. Do you see there's some provisions that 18 Q. 19 relate to customer pilot programs and 20 time-differentiated rates? 21 Α. I do. Do those provisions -- are those also 22 Q. 23 provisions that were negotiated in order to reach 24 this stipulation? A. Yes, they are. 25

- Q. And do you see in those provisions also some benefits to customers with respect to piloting of time-differentiated rates and pilot programs generally?
  - A. I do.
  - Q. On page 12, Section IV of that document.
- A. I have it.
  - Q. Do you see a section related to cyber security?
- 10 A. I do.

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- Q. And does that section in fact provide various measures of transparency for the Commission to track with respect to cyber security as Duke Energy fulfills its deployment?
- 15 A. Yes.
  - Q. And are those additional benefits to customers as a result of this stipulation?
- 18 A. They are.
- 19 Q. Turning to page 16, please.
- 20 A. I have it.
- 21 Q. There is a section there entitled
- 22 | "Reliability and Distribution Efficiency
- 23 | Improvement."
- 24 A. Yes.
- Q. Again, are those elements that were

negotiated as part of this stipulation?

- A. Yes, they are.
- Q. And do you see in those elements additional benefits to customers with respect to tracking reliability as deployment occurs and providing additional detailed information to the staff and other parties?
  - A. I do.
