Are you a customer of Ohio American? 18 19 MR. PINKETT: Yes, I am. 20 HEARING EXAMINER JONES: You may 21 proceed with your statement at this time. 2.2 MR. PINKETT: I live in the Blacklick 23 Estate in the southeast part of town, and as of the 17th of this month I will be there for nine 24 25 years. When I moved into my current residence,

I realized that the water was hard because there was calcium and scale all over the fixtures in the bathroom and all over the shower wall in the bathtub. I had to use CLR and other means to clean a lot of that up.

One of the things that I also had to do was I had to buy a water softening system in order to alleviate the hard water problem.

In 2010 I went to the first hearing that I ever attended concerning the rates on the water rates, and heard some testimony from some of my neighbors about the condition of the water in terms of them having to replace appliances every three to five years, health issues that they had concerns because of the water, and needless to say it made me more concerned about what was going on. I had to replace my hot water tank about three and a half years ago and even spoke to the hot water company as recently as two weeks ago because I have such a sediment buildup in my hot water tank that it sounds like somebody is down there fighting, because when the water tank comes on it's bloom-bloom, bloom-bloom, bloom-bloom because of the amount of sediment that's in the hot water tank.

So along with my neighbors, I do have concerns about the quality of the water in our area, and it's been an on-going problem, I understand, for years. And when the rate increase was talked about in 2010, one of the things that the company had talked about was using that money to improve the quality of the water and to make it better for us, but unfortunately, I don't believe that that's happened because even today, when I run water out of my spigot, the regular spigot, there is a sudsy film in terms of what comes out. So I had to put my dog on the water that I drink because I don't want my dog getting sick.

You can see the difference in terms of the water quality that comes out of the spigot that I drink out of, which has the reverse osmosis water filter, versus what comes out of the regular spigot.

So having talked to my neighbors, that's the reason why I'm down here this morning. I want to make sure that you are aware of the condition of the quality of the water, and we want something done because we don't have some of the services that they have in other

communities, such as water softeners or the reverse osmosis water filter that would make the quality of the water better, and that's something that we need to have.

Another concern that I have is we never know, never know from month to month what my water rates are going to be. One month it might be about 40 bucks and then for the next three months it will go up to almost \$70, so I don't know what system they use to determine what the cost of my water is going to be.

Now, I realize that sometimes I may use a little more water from one month to the next, but it doesn't seem to me that it's that much. It's just me and my grandson living there. We have a pretty much regular schedule for washing clothes, doing dishes, et cetera. We don't run a lot of water, and I can't understand why the rates increase so much from month to month.

So that's another concern that I have, as well as concerns that some of my neighbors have, because one of the other horror stories I was hearing from them is the amount of money that they have to pay for the water. I

```
understand this is a company and they have to, you know, have profits to some degree but we're concerned about the amount of money that we pay for the quality of water that we get.
```

I think that everybody would be less concerned if we were getting a high quality in terms of the water treatment versus what we have to pay. I think that would be more satisfactory to everybody concerned. At least it would be for me. But not getting the high quality of water and having to pay these high rates, that's very unacceptable.

MS. GARDNER: That's okay. I'm not going to wait to bathe until I get this back.

As well, my neighbor and I get together, she teaches me how to make jam, and we use this pot here and boil water repeatedly and then we take the jam and let it sit in here because it will complete the seal on here, like hold it real tight, you know, and then it air dries and you can see all the calcium buildup, and this is just after one time of sitting in the water provided by this Company.

Inside of here is all of the residue left behind after just two, three times of boiling water in here, and you can see sediment at the bottom. So the water is horribly dirty. It's not meant for human consumption, if I'm asked.

I don't bathe my children in this water. I have to order a water softener. My kids can't bathe daily due to the increased cost. So these are some of the concessions that I made. I'm trying not to repeat some things that I offered before.

The cost of our water is about \$250 a month since I do have small children. Again, I never saw anyone come out and read our water, not one time, and I have been in school for the last two years so I'm home all day. Never one time have I seen someone come out and read the meter. So our water cost does fluctuate.

Moreover, we used to constantly see a truck out there turning off the service, and our water has been cut off for past due balance. was past due for \$50, and the reconnection cost was \$55 to turn it back on, so the company is raping our area. We are not able to choose another water company, so we can get at least some quality water because it's upsetting to understand that I'm paying \$250 a month and get this type of water. I own property in Columbus where our water bill is, like, a hundred dollars a month -- I mean, a hundred dollars for three months and the water -- and I didn't grow up privileged so I never bought water, but now I'm paying for a water softener, I'm paying for salt, I'm paying for not only the service to bring it into the house, I'm paying for a filter on my refrigerator just to have clean ice to
