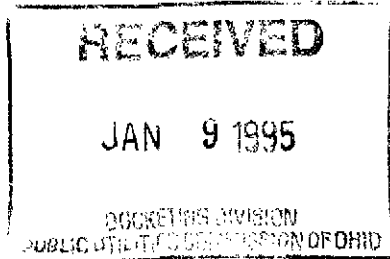

ACCESS AREA

The total geographical area served from a specific central office. Central offices are grouped into three access areas, for purposes of this tariff, based upon the quantity of network access lines served per square mile.

AUDIO RESPONSE UNIT

Mechanized announcement equipment, which uses synthesized speech to quote a telephone number to a customer who has called Directory Assistance Service.

CENTRAL OFFICE

A switching unit, in one location of a telecommunications system providing service to the general public, having the necessary equipment and operating arrangements for terminating and interconnecting lines. More than one central office may be located in the same building.

CENTRAL OFFICE AREA

The specific section of an exchange area served by a particular central office or by a particular group of central offices.

CIRCUIT

The term applied to a channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of telephone service. In the case of battery circuits and generator circuits, each pair of wires or fraction thereof is considered as a separate channel.

CLASS OF SERVICE

The term used in describing exchange service with respect to the character of use to be made of such service. The Telephone Company furnishes two classes of service: residence and non-residence.

COMMON BATTERY SERVICE

The type of telephone service in connection with which electrical energy for talking and signaling is supplied from a central point.

CONNECTING COMPANY (INDEPENDENT COMPANY)

A corporation, association, partnership or individual (other than an Associated Bell Company) owning or operating one or more exchanges and with whom traffic is interchanged.

CUSTOMER

The individual, firm, partnership, association, corporation, municipality, cooperative organization, governmental agency, etc., which contracts for telephone service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the rules and regulations of the Telephone Company.

DERIVED LOCAL CHANNEL

Derived Local Channel is an arrangement that permits multiple and simultaneous use of a single exchange service for voice and/or data communications. The arrangement consists of equipment located in the central office and on the customer premises.

DIRECTORY LISTING

The publication in the Telephone Company's alphabetical directory, or information records, of information relative to a subscriber's telephone number, by which telephone users are enabled to ascertain the telephone number of a desired telephone.

EXCHANGE

A basic unit for the administration of communication service in a specified area, called the exchange area. It usually consists of one or more central offices together with the associated plant used in furnishing communication service in that area.

The territory included within the boundaries of an exchange, as shown on maps on file with The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.

EXCHANGE SERVICE

Exchange service is furnished as customer service, combined customer and public use service (semi-public telephone service), and public telephone service as follows:

1. Customer Service

- a. Flat Rate Service: Exchange service in connection with which a stipulated monthly charge is made covering all local message use within a defined area.
- b. Message Rate Service: Exchange service in connection with which local message use is measured in terms of local messages for purposes of charging for the service.
- c. Measured Rate Service: Exchange service in connection with which local messages are measured in terms of four measured elements, i.e., the total number of outgoing completed local messages, the distance and the duration of each local message and the time of day each local message is originated.

2. Semi-Public Telephone Service

Exchange service for customer and public use, in connection with which local message use is measured in terms of local messages for purposes of charging for the service, in addition to a fixed monthly charge. For purposes of this tariff, the network access line and central office terminations are combined into an exchange access rate. This service is considered as a customer service unless specifically excepted under the various sections.

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3. Public Telephone Service

Exchange service for use by the general public in connection with which local message use is measured in terms of local messages for purposes of charging for the service. This service is not a customer service.

EXPENSE INCURRED BY THE TELEPHONE COMPANY

Wherever "expense incurred by the Telephone Company" is applied in this tariff, such expense consists of an estimate of the expenditure by the Telephone Company for labor, material, engineering, supervision, motor vehicles, tool and any other expenditure incident thereto, to the extent that any or all of such items are applicable in the particular situation involved.

FAMILY

A group of persons, related either by blood or by marriage or adoption. In addition, single persons living alone and small groups of unrelated persons sharing the same living accommodations as "partners" shall be considered as families.

FOREIGN CENTRAL OFFICE SERVICE

Exchange service furnished from a central office other than that regularly serving the central office area in which the customer is located.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE

Exchange service furnished from an exchange other than that which regularly serves the exchange area in which the customer is located.

GRADE OF SERVICE

The term used in describing exchange service with respect to the number of customers which may be connected to a line. The Telephone Company furnishes the following grades of service: individual and PBX trunks.

INDIVIDUAL

An exchange service connecting one customer's premises with the central office.

MISCELLANEOUS COMMON CARRIERS

A Miscellaneous Common Carrier, as defined in part 21 of the Rules and Regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, is a person engaged in rendering communications service for hire to the public who is not engaged in the business of providing either a public landline message telephone service or public message telegraph service. For purposes of this and all other Telephone Company tariffs, the term "Miscellaneous Common Carrier" shall apply only to such carriers, as defined above, who are duly licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and have tariffs filed with that Commission and The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.

NETWORK ACCESS LINE

NETWORK INTERFACE (NI)

The network interface is a unit provided as part of the network access line. (T)
The network interface will be installed on the customer's premises at a location determined by the Telephone Company which is accessible to the customer. The normal location of the network interface would be in close proximity to the protector or point of minimum penetration where the Telephone Company facilities enter the customer's premises.

NETWORK WIRING

Wiring on the network side of the Network Interface at the customer's premises which is used for the termination of network access lines. (T)

NORMAL EXCHANGE

The exchange which normally serves the exchange area in which the customer is located.

NORMAL WORKING DAYS

All days except Sundays and except Christmas Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day, day after Thanksgiving, Washington-Lincoln Day, and Good Friday.

OTHER COMMON CARRIER

Specialized Common Carriers, Domestic and International Record Carriers and Domestic Satellite Carriers engaged in providing such private line voice, data, or video services or other services as such carriers may be authorized by the Federal Communications Commission to provide.

PBX TRUNK

A class of exchange service used when connecting switching equipment located at the customer's premises to the central office. (N)

PREMISES WIRING

PRIVATE PROPERTY

The continuous plot of ground owned or leased and occupied by a customer and not separated by public highways or by property occupied by others.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY

A road, street, highway, way, lane or alley under the control of and kept by the public.

PUBLIC TELEPHONE STATION

(T) (1)

A company station installed at the Telephone Company's initiative, or at its option, at a location chosen or accepted by the Company as suitable and necessary for furnishing service to the general public.

RATE CENTER

A centralized point within a central office area or exchange area which is established for the purpose of measuring airline mileage between central office areas or exchange areas. Each rate center is assigned a unique pair of vertical and horizontal coordinates as described in the Message Telecommunications Service Tariff.

RELAY CIRCUIT

An arrangement of circuits to provide for electrical separation, but at the same time allow for the transfer or passage of operations from one circuit to one or more circuits, and also to provide where necessary, additional sources of energy.

REPEATER

A combination of one or more amplifiers together with their associated equipment, so arranged as to provide for two-way transmission in a telephone circuit.

RESIDENCE LOCATION

A place in which a person actually lives continuously and which is considered to be the person's home is a residence location.

ROTARY SERVICE

An arrangement under which two or more exchange services of the same class and grade, or PBX trunks of the same class, served from the same central office and furnished to the same customer, are grouped so that calls to the first number of the group are automatically routed to the first non-busy number of the group, and a busy signal or busy report is not given unless all the grouped numbers are busy. (C)

SEMI-PUBLIC TELEPHONE STATION

(T) (1)

A Company station designed for use by the customer and the general public at locations somewhat public in character, but not suitable for the installation of a public telephone.

SERVICE AREA FUNCTION--See Private Line Service Tariff.

SHARED TENANT SERVICE

The resale or sharing of local exchange service in a multi-tenant single building, or a contiguous complex of buildings under common ownership or management, on non-residence individual and PBX trunks, semi-public service and Centrex stations. (C)

TELEPHONE COMPANY

The Ohio Bell Telephone Company

TERMINAL

The designation given the equipment with which a circuit is connected or the equipment on which a circuit terminates. (C)

With respect to this use of the term, the Telephone Company furnishes three types of service: customer service, public telephone service and semi-public telephone service.
2. The comparative limitation which the Telephone Company places on the number of times customer service may be used for the stipulated monthly charge. 3. The physical characteristics of the services, with respect to this use of the term, the Telephone Company furnishes only common battery dial service.

USUAL WORKING HOURS

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this tariff, the service of a customer may, upon the consent of the customer and provided there is no interruption or relocation of the service, be assigned or transferred as follows:

To another individual, partnership, association or corporation, provided such party does not continue to do business at the same location and 1) there is no outstanding indebtedness related to contracted-for services, including advertising in classified directories, or 2) if any such outstanding indebtedness exists the individual, partnership, association or corporation assumes all such outstanding indebtedness and the unexpired portion of the contract. To a receiver, trustee or other person appointed by a court or acting pursuant to law in bankruptcy, receivership, reorganization, insolvency, liquidation or other similar proceedings, provided 1) there is no outstanding indebtedness related to contracted-for services, including advertising in classified directories or 2) if any such outstanding indebtedness exists the receiver, trustee or other person appointed by a court or acting pursuant to law in bankruptcy, receivership, reorganization, insolvency, liquidation or other similar proceedings assumes all such outstanding indebtedness and the unexpired portion of the contract. (C)

2. Residence Service

- a. If the customer no longer resides at the premises to be served, to another individual. (C)
 - b. If the customer continues to reside at the premises to be served, to another individual provided the transferee assumes all outstanding indebtedness for such service and the unexpired portion of the initial contract period applicable to such service, if any. (C)

For payment periods longer than one month, the customer may prepay the total outstanding recurring charges for items under a VTPP contract. 3.10 Educational Discount

An Educational Discount of 10% applies to all Elementary and Secondary schools which are chartered by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 3301.16, Revised Code. The discount is applicable to the total bill amount of all Ameritech Ohio's regulated tariffed recurring, nonrecurring and usage charges.

However, to permit each customer, independent of distance from the central office, to supply signal power which at the central office approximates 12dB below one milliwatt when averaged over any three second interval, the Telephone Company, at the customer's request, will specify, for each customer location, the signal power at the output of the network control signaling unit, which shall in no case exceed one milliwatt.

- (2) When extension service is provided within an exchange area other than the Telephone Company exchange areas specified in (1) preceding, the provisions of e, Foreign exchange extension service, following apply.
- (3) Subject to the provisions of (1) preceding, local and interoffice circuits for extension service are furnished under the regulations and rates set forth in 2.4 following.

e. Foreign exchange extension service

(1) Interexchange circuits

- (a) Extension service which is associated with local exchange service or foreign central office service and is located within an exchange area other than a Telephone Company exchange area which is in the local service area of the customer's main location is classified as foreign exchange extension service for which an interexchange circuit is required, measured between the rate centers of the exchange areas involved. (T)
- (b) Extension service which is associated with foreign exchange service and is located in an exchange area other than the Telephone Company exchange areas specified in d-(1) preceding is classified as foreign exchange extension service. The required interexchange circuit is measured between the rate center of the exchange area in which the extension service is located and either the rate center of the exchange area where the customer is located or the rate center of the exchange area from which the foreign exchange service was requested, whichever will result in a lower circuit rate to the customer.
- (c) Subject to the provisions of (a) and (b) preceding, interexchange circuits are furnished under the regulations and rates set forth in 3-b preceding.

(2) Local and interoffice circuits associated with interexchange circuits

- (a) A circuit (local or interoffice and local, as appropriate) is required, measured between the extension service location and the serving rate center.
- (b) Where the main location of the associated local exchange service is in a multi-office exchange area and such main location is not within the rate center central office, an inter-office circuit between the central office areas involved is required. (T)

(c) Where foreign exchange extension service is associated with foreign central office service and neither the central office in which the customer is located nor the central office from which the service is being furnished is the rate center central office, an interoffice circuit is required, measured between the rate center central office and whichever of the aforementioned central offices will result in a lower circuit rate to the customer.

(d) Subject to the provisions of (a), (b) and (c) preceding, local and interoffice circuits are furnished under the regulations and rates set forth in 2.4 following.

f. Requests to furnish exchange service from another central office

(T)

Where service is furnished from a multi-office exchange area and the customer requests that the service be furnished from a central office other than as determined by the Telephone Company under the provisions of F-2-a preceding, a chargeable interoffice circuit between the central office areas involved is required.

g. Requests to furnish exchange service from another exchange area

(T)

Where under the provisions of G-2-a preceding, the Telephone Company determines that service will be furnished from an exchange area other than that from which service is requested and the customer insists that the service be furnished from the exchange area from which he requested service, the service will be so furnished; however, where the furnishing of the service from the exchange area from which service was requested requires the installation of additional equipment and facilities, such as loading coils, repeaters, special relay circuits, signaling circuits, etc., for local or toll transmission and supervisory purposes, additional charges based upon costs incurred may be applied.

 - (2) Postpay stations - Payment for the use of such stations must be deposited at the time a connection is established.
 - (3) Dial tone first stations - Connection with a Telephone Company operator or with certain designated emergency numbers can be established without deposit of payment. All other connections are established on a prepay basis.
- b. Coin telephones are regularly provided in colors (including black) from time to time considered standard by the Telephone Company for such telephones at no additional charge for such color.
