As an all-electric home customer I am totally perplexed at what is happening with our electric rates in OHIO! The bills are so convoluted it is nearly impossible to decipher what is going on with our ever-changing and the invoicing -- I am not totally oblivious of understanding billing invoices; the Ohio Edison bills are very difficult for the average person to interpret. Some of us have given up trying to make sense of the monthly bills.
