MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

A PUCO Staff representative recently conducted an investigation of the Mill Street grade crossing and expressed concern regarding the location of the cantilever placement in the northwest quadrant of the crossing – specifically, that the cantilever may be too close to the track and roadway, and thus not MUTCD-compliant. To the undersigned's understanding, the Staff representative suggested that the cantilever may be unnecessary and thus appropriate for removal, but that this would require Commission approval.

Toward that end, Norfolk Southern respectfully requests that the Commission convene a diagnostic review at this crossing, toward determining whether the cantilever in the northwest quadrant is in fact mandated, and assuming it is not, that the Commission issue an Order authorizing Norfolk Southern to remove the cantilever.
