ENTRY

The Commission finds:

- (1) On June 7, 2012, Donald and Margaret Quallen (complainants) filed a complaint against Duke Energy Ohio, Inc. (Duke or respondent) concerning a humming sound emanating from a utility pole that caused a vibration within their home.
- (2) Duke filed an answer to the complaint on June 26, 2012. Concurrently, Duke filed a motion to dismiss in which it asserted that it had removed the capacitor and equipment from the utility pole, thus providing the relief sought by the complainants.
- (3) On July 16, 2012, the parties filed a joint motion to dismiss the complaint with prejudice. The parties explain that all issues raised by the complaint have been resolved to the satisfaction of the parties.
- (4) Upon being advised by the parties that the issues raised by the complaint have been resolved, the Commission concludes that the joint motion to dismiss with prejudice is reasonable and should be granted.


It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That, in accordance with Finding (4), the joint motion to dismiss the complaint with prejudice is granted. It is, further,


ORDERED, That a copy of this entry be served upon all parties and interested persons of record.




