MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

A motor vehicle struck and irreparably damaged the foundation/cantilever assembly in the northeast quadrant of the State Street grade crossing, resulting in the need for its removal. The Ohio Rail Development Commission ("ORDC") recently convened a diagnostic review at the crossing, with the goal of collaborating on a comprehensive project to include warning device installation, coupled with traffic signal preemption. In the interim, Norfolk Southern respectfully requests that the Commission issue an Order authorizing Norfolk Southern to defer the replacement of the cantilever which had existed in the northeast quadrant of the crossing, and to maintain in its stead a mast-mounted flasher with gate, and high flashers mounted on a standoff bracket.

In light of the complexity of the project (including, e.g., design, engineering, and then the installation of warning devices and traffic signal preemption, etc.), Norfolk Southern respectfully requests this authority (that is, to defer the replacement of the cantilever) for a period of eighteen (18) months from the date upon the Commission issues the related construction order.

The interested parties (the ORDC, Norfolk Southern, and the City) are working well together here, and approve of the instant request.
